

I am not at all concerned about, how shall I say this, an argument I once had about an alligator that was believed to be Big Foot. The discussion emerged in a small establishment in Tampa, Florida that served both beer and sandwiches. I am very interested in things that go bump in the night and upset our normal and safe belief patterns, and so I was intrigued. There is much more to the world than we believe, and probably much more going on than we can believe. Now I definitely believe in alligators and once very nearly stepped on one, a good 10-12 footer, or so it seemed at the time, exaggeration is possible in stressed situations. I really did not stay around to measure. Fortunately this alligator was either deep into sleep, lazy, or not hungry. But Big Foot, that is an open question. Show me evidence.

The claim was made by another young man, and I too was quite young at the time, although I would have told you I was quite mature, that he had seen "Big-Foot" while canoeing at night on the Hillsborough River, just to the north of Tampa. He knew this, he claimed, because his headlamp had picked up the glow of Big Foot's eyes. Well, I don't know if you have ever been in a swampy area in Florida at night with only a headlamp, but in the surrounding darkness and with the mists that rise off the water and the night sounds, it can be a very spooky place, and very nearly anything can be "seen." Add to this that this same young gentleman, who occasionally drank a bit, gave me expert advice on canoes. Aluminum canoes he claimed, were much better than fiberglass canoes. The reason: he had once backed his fiberglass canoe into his garage and it fractured so that it was unfixable. His aluminum canoe, suffering the same indignity, was easily pounded back into shape.

And so, the argument did not distress me or cause me to change my beliefs or even come to mind except at odd times like this one. But then there are times when arguments do have force and we often react to them, sometimes violently. When this happens we need to take a step back and examine what we truly believe, because we do not get excited about challenges to the truths that we hold firmly. These truths are almost unshakeable. When, as occasionally happens, I read a book or essay the ends up in the shredder I find that inevitably I need to reorder the book and read it carefully to discover which beliefs have been challenged and about which I am certainly uncertain. Guaranteed I will find a belief that I hold with no strong conviction and that needs to be tossed into the dustbin of oblivion.

Sometimes God confronts us directly as Jesus so often did with the ubiquitous Scribes and Pharisees who held many beliefs with no biblical support and often with no support at all. It is easy to see why the religious authorities felt so threatened by Jesus. However there is another kind of change that comes upon us gently and more powerfully than the change evoked by logic and argument, if logic and argument ever provoked anything other than more argument and less logic. Over the years I watched my mother change. She changed from a child with a hyper fundamentalist – at one time called fighting fundamentalists – background to an aged and graceful Episcopalian who received the sacraments and prayed out of the prayer book, that is "The Book of Common Prayer." Her copy of this book is well used, well worn, and precious. I use it for the collects, ancient and contemporary, well, sort of contemporary. It reminds me, as some of its pages are falling out, of my grandmother's Bible, which I also have with its New Testament read to shreds.

This brings me to my main point, our own, PC(USA) Book of Common Worship: Daily Prayer. I have given away many copies of this little book and if you do not have one I will gladly give you one, free of charge, whether you are a church member or not, and even whether you are a Christian or not, and even if you are an atheist and hate Christianity and think it the scourge of the earth. I will gladly give you a copy. If you use it properly it will change your life, even if you hate change and fear to have your ultimate beliefs shattered and torn to shreds. I will not try to convince you that alligators are a stand in for Big Foot. I will simply let the Holy Spirit do its work as I am convinced is happening both inside and outside the church. Hang on for the ride, God is moving!

If you have a copy of this book read through today's morning prayer, if not, just follow along. The "argument" is the same. In today's prayer the pronouns are collective. The word "I" is not used. The prayers are not about me. In the collective wisdom of the church – and the PC(USA) - we wisely used much from the "Book of Common Prayer." Prayer is about calling God into our world, or, recognizing God here and now. Read on, I pray. We can conclude with this little collect. "Eternal God, you call us to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**"

Who among us is brave enough to pray that prayer? May God strengthen us through the Holy Spirit. **Amen.** from Pastor Pete



From the Poke Run Budget & Finance Committee

TAKE NOTE: FROM Tim Martin, Chairman Budget & Finance Committee

"We've recently been asked what affect the new tax laws will have on giving to Poke Run Church. Frankly speaking, there are concerns that the new bill could negatively affect giving. Nationwide, many tax attorneys and universities that study these issues are publicly stating that "the potential negative impact on charitable giving estimated to be \$13 Billion in a recent study means churches and charities are a loser from this legislation". Other tax experts are saying the opposite that the bill "might actually increase giving because of the economic growth and tax reductions".

As a congregation, Poke Run has weathered some economic struggles over the course of history. This congregation has continually shown it is very committed to supporting its Mission & and Benevolence programs externally, as well as its internal budget needs. The last 15 months have been remarkable. The Current Fund started 2017 underfunded by almost \$10,000. The situation was bleak, and got worse through the summer. There was actually some talk about cutting some of our budget line items during the summer months. The giving was slow at first, but then it stepped up and the last quarter was extra-ordinarily strong. We finished the year with an excess of over \$20,000.

We, as the Budget & Finance Committee will continue to look at our program offerings, insuring we are good stewards of the gifts we receive. We will continue to work with the Mission and Stewardship Committee in supporting programs outside our church –what makes sense to fund and how to support the programs. Furthermore, we meet on a consistent basis with our financial consultants to maximize our returns on our investment portfolio, in a conservative growth risk managed process. We have found that our endowment fund alternatives are a good option for those who want to give money to Poke Run in non-traditional way. We continue to be blessed and amazed at the generosity of our members.

Things are cyclical in culture and there will always be some tough economic times, but we think Poke Run is poised to weather those "storms". Thanks to all who support the programs at Poke Run Presbyterian Church. Giving of your time, talents and offerings do make a difference!

Stories of Redstone

Christ at work in our midst

Preschool has become a great way for kids to prepare for kindergarten and beyond. Some of the churches in our presbytery have fantastic preschools that have helped children learn in an environment that emphasizes God's love for all of creation and its creatures. Our preschools can be a great outreach to families in the community, and even provide a safe space for families to explore their faith with the church community. Here are two great preschools in our Presbyterian churches:



Started in 1978 as a "Parents' Day Out," **Newlonsburg Church Preschool in Murrysville** operates from Labor Day to Memorial Day, with options 3 days a week that include full day and half day class times.
