"Bringing God's Word to all people in this place and time."

We are today, March 1, 2018, exactly one month away from Easter Sunday, April 1, 2018. April 1 is April Fool's Day. I am sure that much will be said relating April Fool's Day with Christianity. Sermons will be preached, essays like this one written, discussions will abound, newscasters and political pundits and comedians of all sorts on the political left and right will have their say. Or perhaps not; Easter may still be too solemn and too precious a memory. Or, it may be that no one cares any more. Spring break seems to take precedence on college campuses and in the news media. Oh well!

Whatever may or may not be the case I want you to set aside your Bibles for a moment and imagine with me. Yes, I said imagine. The imagination is used far too little these days. We spend our time in front of screens, phones, tablets, laptops, desktops, TVs, and movies, Games, Virtual Reality in a variety of forms, heads up displays, and holographic images, and whatever is to come. All information comes to us predigested and intact. We do not have to think or analyze or ponder. We accept as is. This is dangerous to us and to the future, so imagine with me if you still can. Suppose we did not have the Bible.

The world would not erupt into chaos. It did not do so before the Bible was written and it will not do so if we continue to disregard and forget the Bible. The world will simply continue on as it is. There will be some periods of peace, some periods of war, some good governments and some bad governments. Some of the very best of moral philosophy comes to us from outside of the Jewish-Christian religion. Buddha and his noble way does not do badly. Neither do the stoics who are much appreciated these days. The world might look like China, or India, or any of a number of other regions that are little influenced, if at all, by Christianity or Judaism. In fact, there is much we can learn from these cultures. If my old seminary professor Charles Partee was right and my memory correct, Calvin read the stoic Seneca every day of his life; something to think about.

So what does Christianity offer us that we cannot find in say, Plato, or Cicero, or the Buddha, or the Chicken Soup for the Soul series, or Oprah, or ... Open your Bibles and read.

To begin I will quote the Dutch theologian Herman Bavinck: (Yes, you can groan) "The essence of the Christian religion consists on the reality that the creation of the Father, ruined by sin, is restored in the death the Son of God, and re-created by the grace of the Holy Spirit. (in volume 1 of his Dogmatics, p. 38)

A good summary – that does not answer our question, but defines its boundaries."

What Christianity does and as far as I know other religions, faiths, or philosophies do not do, is define itself as love for the other person, God and neighbor, as prior to love for oneself. The Christian faith first points out the pernicious stubbornness of our own self-serving will, even if this selfishness is painful to others. It then offers us a solution by offering to us grace by connecting us to the most loving power invading the Universe. This power is God become and in Jesus of Nazareth who lives with us and suffers with us and dies at our – selfish – hands. Understanding this – that God loves us first – before Godself – frees us from our own total selfishness, a selfishness that isolates us from both our own selves and others. Now we can Love God totally, love our neighbors, and love ourselves.

When we live like this, in the divine and loving image of the God who created us, it forms a new world, a good world, a world in which our selfishness does not isolate from others. This isolation by the way is, biblically speaking, called "Death." Rather we enter into life, life defined by connection and relationship through love, not our love though, but God's love given to us through grace.

On this basis, Christianity is nothing to fool with, especially at Easter; it brings life where by Pas otherwise there is death.

The season of **Lent** is a time of prayer, fasting and self-examination in preparation for the celebration of the resurrection of the Lord at Easter. It is a period of 40 days — like the flood of Genesis, Moses' sojourn at Mount Sinai, Elijah's journey to Mount Horeb, Jonah's call to Ninevah to repent and Jesus' time of testing in the wilderness.



Palm Sunday begins Holy Week, a time in the church year when we remember how Christ gave his life in love for the world. As this service opens, the crowd waves palm branches, wanting to crown Jesus as king. But as the story of the passion unfolds, their shouts of praise turn to demands for his crucifixion; he receives a crown of thorns as he is handed over to be mocked and killed. **Palm Sunday Worship, Sunday March 25th, and plan on attending a luncheon prepared by the Poke Run Deacons, immediately following the 11am worship.**



Maundy Thursday begins the Three Days, remembering the new commandment that Christ gave us in word and deed as he taught us how to love one another, washing our feet as a servant. We also celebrate the Lord's Supper, remembering the meal Christ shared with his disciples before his death. Maundy Thursday Worship on **March 29th Come and share a meal together. Dinner at 6pm, before Worship Service at 7:30pm.**



Good Friday is the day we remember Jesus' crucifixion. It is an especially important time to pray for the church and the world for whom Christ gave his life.



The festival of the Resurrection of the Lord, **Easter Sunday** is the center of the Christian year. On this occasion the church joyfully proclaims the good news that is at the very heart of the gospel: that Jesus Christ is risen from the dead....Easter Sunday is something like the keystone of an arch — the top and center stone upon which all the other stones lean and depend — both in terms of its theological significance and its relation to other events in the Christian year. Theologically speaking, the faith we claim and the life we live depend on the affirmation, celebration and proclamation of Christ's resurrection.

Countless studies have shown that we all learn in different ways. Some learn best by listening to a lecture, others need to interact and experiment with the material. Gardner's multiple intelligences theory lists 8 ways in which people learn: visual, musical, kinesthetic, interpersonal, logical, verbal, & intrapersonal. It stands to reason that if we learn in different ways, then we each probably connect with our faith in different ways too.



A great way to tap into this variation on worship is to set up "prayer stations." Stations can be tactile, reflective, creative, and simple. Many prayer station tracks will have a particular focus, such as a Biblical theme (Waiting; Fruits of the Spirit) or a Bible Story (Advent/Birth of Jesus; Holy Week.) You can find loads of station ideas to incorporate into your worship services or special prayer room on Pinterest, websites such as engageworship.org, rethinkingyouthministry.com, and in books like "Creative Prayer" by Faith McCloud.
