Tuesday November 20th 7:30pm A short lifetime ago, while sitting in either a Doctor's or Dentist's waiting room, I read a Reader's Digest article about a taxi company. I do not remember the details. I only remember that this particular company found themselves close to bankruptcy due to the high costs of accidents and the following astronomical costs of insurance. Again I do not remember in any great detail but I do remember that they instituted a few simple rules for all their taxi drivers. Do not run yellow lights. Always come to a complete stop at a stop sign, and then wait at least three seconds before proceeding, after looking all ways. Do the same for stoplights, pause before rushing off at a green light. Nothing new or spectacular, just a few simple easily remembered and followed rules. What happened surprised everyone. The accident rate plummeted to almost zero. Costs of operation went down, profits went up, everyone is happier. This happened because of a return to a few simple rules that define the basics of driving. The Christian life can be lived almost the same way.

Only I am not going to suggest a few simple rules to live by. This has been tried before and found to have little effect on how people actually live their lives. Human beings are much more complicated than city streets and traffic patterns. Besides, even if we follow the rules, not everyone else does. Life must be more flexible and, to live in harmony with the dozens to hundreds of people with whom we will interact would require a rule base of thousands of rules. That is why Jesus and the apostle Paul after him did not have much use for rules or laws. We need something much simpler to structure our lives and interactions with other people.

You might have noticed that John the Baptist first gives a few simple rules for living that are more than rules. Sandwiched in between two horrible sets of warnings of pain and judgment, " ... the crowds asked him, "What then shall we do?" And he answered them, "Whoever has two tunics is to share with him who has none, and whoever has food is to do likewise." Now this would be pretty easy for most of us Americans although extremely difficult for those listening to John. Not to mention that it leaves immense freedoms beyond simple sharing g of goods. What are we to make of this?

As with so much of Scripture the message is not so much in the words as behind the words. John drives at something more basic than giving away an extra coat. John would have us consider the needs of people less fortunate than ourselves. Even more he gives us the concept of sharing or passing on our blessings. Jesus drives the point deeper. "Do not be anxious ... consider the lilies of the field ... which are ... dressed even more splendidly than Solomon." All that we need flows from God allowing us to freely give.

Still, I want to say something more, something that hangs at the edge of these speeches and maxims and parables, something not yet fully expressed in them. The Word that lies still hidden in the words, the Word spoken to us 2000 years after some unknown scribe scribbled down the words of Peter and Luke and Matthew John and Jesus. I want us to hear what Jesus said to us, to you and I reading this in 2018. Something big lies between us, between the characters of the gospels and we here in the 21<sup>st</sup> century. That something is the resurrection. Creation – perfect; humanity less than perfect; redemption – accomplished; now we wait for the final perfect recreation of the world – a time of restoration. This is our calling, for those of us called into Christ's church. We are called to work along with God to rebuild creation until the final restoration. This involves not the giving away of our excess but the giving of what is most precious to God, our very self, our life lived under His will.

To Accept the "Terms of Call" as proposed by Poke Run Budget & Finance Committee and approved by the Poke Run Session.

**Tim Martin** presented the entire Current Fund Budget, including Pastoral Terms of Call and the Benevolence Budget proposed by the Mission & Stewardship Committee to the congregation. He spoke of the solid giving and stewardship dedicated by the Poke Run congregation which meets all of the Current Expenses. He pointed out that not all area congregations are so able. Salaries were held with no increase in 2017, included in limited increases in 2018, but will all be raised 3% in for 2019. In addition, Poke Run's *First Fruit* pledge to the Redstone Presbytery will be increased to \$42.50 per member. The investment portfolio of Poke Run remains strong,; the balance is back to where it was before the new addition. The Trustees have made many improvements in 2018 especially at the manse. For 2019, the kitchen/ Fellowship Hall/Storage room will be upgraded. This project will be funded through the Unrestricted investment funds of the church. Tim finished his report by expressing a hope that someone from the general congregation might like to join the Budget & Finance Committee. If anyone wishes to join the Committee or has questions or concerns about the budget, please bring them to someone on the Budget & Finance Committee.

## Christ at work in our midst

### Counting our historic blessings

November is a season of thanksgiving. This year, we are grateful for these historic churches that have endured the test of time and are celebrating anniversaries.

"Celebrating milestones in our congregations serves as tangible reminders that we belong



to Jesus Christ and to a Church where our testimony builds on the faithful witness of a community who served the Lord in this same place," said Executive Presbyter Skip Noftzger.

**235 years.** Congruity Presbyterian Church in New Alexandria reached out in mission by planting two other churches since it's beginning in 1780. 75 members went to create Community Presbyterian in 1837 and 60 members planted the Delmont Presbyterian Church in 1849.

**200 years.** Bethel Presbyterian Church in New Florence was originally built as a stone church. To celebrate its history the congregation created a memory quilt from old photos.

**125 years.** Avonmore Presbyterian began in 1893 with eighteen charter members and quickly grew to almost fifty. Within a year they built a wood-frame church and continued to grow. Music has been a significant part of its ministry.
