We will begin with a story, and a quote:

"When the guru sat down to worship the ashram (place of worship) cat would get in the way and distract the worshippers. So he ordered that the cat be tied during the evening worship.

After the guru died the cat continued to be tied during evening worship. And when the cat expired another cat was brought to the ashram so that it could be duly tied during evening worship.

Centuries later learned treatises were written by the guru's scholarly disciples on the literal significance of tying up a cat while worship is performed. " *Tony DeMello*

"... the gravest errors as well as the most tormenting perplexities arise from (humanity's) understanding the Bible always according to its apparent literal meaning." *Maimonides*



We would like to pick up the Bible, read it, and understand it, just the plain words. But we read it, and especially if we begin at its beginning and read straight through, we find ourselves more often than not perplexed. We might even find ourselves angry, disappointed, or appalled. We find strange rituals and ways of worship that make no sense to us. We discover that the Bible is not what we expected it to be. It is a strange and disorienting book.

Before tossing the Bible aside let me introduce you to the Lindy effect. The Lindy effect says that the longer something has been in existence the longer it is likely continue in existence. I ran across this idea in the writing of Nicholas Nassim Taleb. It made me think. The New Testament itself and the Christianity it formed have been around for close to 2000 years. The Old Testament has been around in one form or another for close to 2000 years before that. This means Judaism and Christianity are likely to be around for a long, long, time. Which tells me, things do not last unless they have value, and they do not have value unless they are true. To know the truth of Christianity we enter the world of the Bible, reading with faith in order to understand.

To come to understand the Bible is like coming to know a good friend. It takes time. We may have many acquaintances and we may have dozens or hundreds or thousands of Facebook friends. The same can be said of Twitter and Instagram followers. For the most part these are people we do not know or know well. There are then those few persons whom we know well and have known perhaps all our life. When we get to know someone well, we come to know them as they truly are, with all their quirks and oddities, even annoyances. We love them anyway, not in spite of but because of, just as they are. To come to know someone like this takes time. It is not a matter of days or weeks. It is years, lots of years. What I am suggesting is that we come to know the Bible as a life-long friend by spending time with it, getting to know its ins and outs, its "quirks and oddities." After a while they are not so odd; they are familiar, like an old flannel shirt. You will find that word by word you are led into mysteries you once did not know existed. You will find that "the most tormenting perplexities" mesh to lead to greater knowledge and truth. St. Paul commends his protégé Timothy for having from childhood "been acquainted with the sacred writings" – the Old Testament – "which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Jesus Christ."

This last is a powerful statement. It is not just the Gospels, or the New Testament Letters, that will bring to us the message of salvation and stir us to repentance. The Old Testament, the sacred writings as Paul names them, will do so as well. To read it and discover its truths we must read beyond the surface, into its depths, to find the living and true God who sacrificed Himself on our behalf. These are not ordinary words we read. You see, "All Scripture is breathed out by God ..." As you sit with Scripture you will come to realize that you have not just entered into its world, you have entered into the Kingdom of God; it all makes sense now.

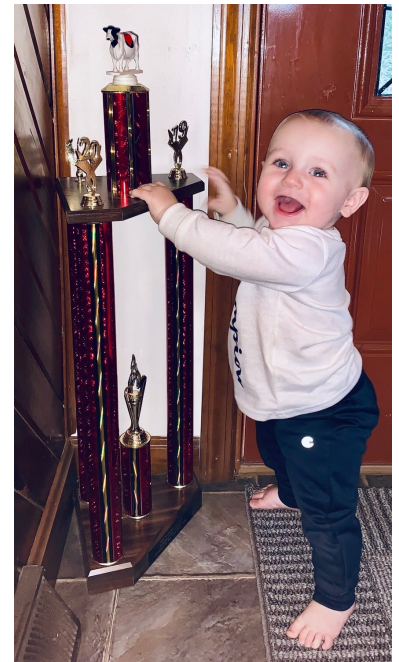
