"Why art thou cast down O my soul? And why art thou disquieted in me? Hope thou in God: for I shall yet praise Him for the help of His countenance." Psalm 42.5

This verse is repeated in a slightly different form just a few lines later:

"Why art thou cast down O my soul? And why art thou disquieted within me? Hope thou n God: for I shall yet praise Him who is the health of my countenance and my God." Psalm 42:11

Eugene Peterson in *The Message* translates the verse this way: "Why are you down in the dumps dear soul? Why are you crying the blues? Fix my eyes on God – Soon I'll be praising again. He puts a smile on my face. He's my God."

Life has a way of playing hardball with us. In the physical world there is no time out. The laws of nature grind away and there are no exceptions. In the words of Mae West, "Gravity always wins." This is one approach to the first line, "Why are you cast down O my soul?" or the more picturesque, "Why are you down in the dumps dear soul?" Why, because I really am ill, I really do hurt. This is a real problem and it in not going away anytime soon. "Life" as we call it happens and there is no way around it. No one is arguing that there are not times when one is cast down into the dumps.

Our emotional lives can be cast into turmoil as well. So can our psychological lives. And, I will also give a nod to the neuro-scientists who will tell us that it is all brain and nothing else. Only a nod for I am a firm believer that we are a mind in a body with a soul. I can think – and I do not believe my thinking is a delusion produced by the brain. This is giving too much agency to chemistry. I can change my mind. My soul, and here I gladly leap into the world called metaphysics, is a gift breathed into me by God, a theological and Christian belief, with powerful inferential and inductive force behind it. It is soul that will make what I say work. It is soul that is the foundational agency of a human life.

All this to say, sometimes we are down in the dumps. There is for a time a period of general malaise. This is a "fact of life." It happens to Christians and it happens to non-Christians.

How do I fix it? The answer lies in the Psalm above. "Hope in God," or "Fix (your) eyes on God." Slowly, or quickly, God will work in God's own ways and times for your greatest good. He may work through the remarkable healing properties of the human body. He may work through the healing methods of modern medicine and science. He may work healing through the presence of friends and family.

The apostle Paul, when he finds himself in prison and faces death, spins out a little soliloquy for us.

He asks which is better, to go or to stay. If he chooses death, he chooses to be with the Lord. This means his current suffering and distress will be replaced by eternal bliss. If he chooses to stay he will have the pleasure and challenge of his early church communities. In times like this we pray, to discern the will of God and to find the path being laid out before us.

The promise, the only promise here is – we should not read into this more than is here – is that "I shall yet praise him." It is our countenance, our sense of well-being that God enhances. This is a way of saying that our souls are secure in God's care. There is a cycle in living before God. There is the full impact of living in a world gone mad. There is the dealing with our human body-mind-soul with all its strengths and weaknesses. And yes, there is the challenge of living a life of faith, for which we require grace and regeneration. Finally there is the promise, "We shall again praise Him." Live into this promise.
