HELLO SEPTEMBER

"THE RANGER" Poke Run Presbyterian Church 2019

This month I am going to reflect in two directions, into the past and then into the very near past. Some of this comes from memory that I believe is well riveted in fact, simply because I love the story. I have kept it alive in memory. The other, the near past, is still fresh enough to be accurate reporting. Both of these events are connected by a similar

thread of thought, the mental state of those who call themselves Christians, or as we would say today, self-identify as "Christian."

Just after World War 2 a man named Gordon Cosby, who had spent the war as a paratrooper chaplain, preached at an evangelistic service. He must have preached a long time because it was late at night when he started home and being too tired to drive he and his wife found a room over a bar in which they could stay for the night. The problem was, although he was exhausted, he could not sleep, it was too noisy. Loud music, loud voices, and laughter filled the room. Other people might have been angry. Other people might have gone downstairs and raised a ruckus, but not Gordon. He thought about what was happening and like all creative persons, asked questions, one in particular. "Why is it that these people below me are so happy when the people I preached to earlier were so solemn, sad even, dour and inanimate?"

Karen and I just returned from a music conference in Nashville. It was a gathering of some 6000 persons who would call themselves "evangelical Christians." Some of the big names of the fundamental side of evangelical Christianity were there including John Piper and John MacArthur. The Gettys, modern hymn writers with a huge following – in the evangelical world – were there. I am not sure that I saw even a single smile among this group over the entire three days we were at the conference. I did hear a lot of bragging though, about how big, how many, etc.

Now in contrast in the same hotel complex – the complex was huge – was a group of firemen also attending their conference. They were having a great time. Lots of spirited conversation; lots of laughter. The question is obvious, "Why the difference?" Gordon Cosby did not answer that question directly. However, after a period of thought and prayer he answered it by starting a church, or maybe not a church as most of us would understand "church." The following is a quote from Religion and Ethics Weekly, October 31, 1997.

"Fifty years ago this month, an ex-paratroop chaplain helped found a small, nondenominational church in Washington, DC. It's never had more than 130 members, but many church historians say it's become one of the most admired places of worship in the country. Its name is the Church of the Savior. At its retreat center near Washington, the Church of the Savior's 50th birthday reunion was so characteristically low key, you might not have realized looking on that these few people all but reinvented what it means to be a church. (underline is mine) The Church of the Savior was founded in 1947 by a former paratroop chaplain, Gordon Cosby, his wife Mary, and five others. Its home became a large house, not a church building, and its members' first priority was total commitment to Christian life. (bold is mine)"

"To be a member requires silent retreats, two years of study, an hour a day of prayer and meditation, and tithing at least 10 percent of income.

... Then out of that, we feel, comes the capacity to do that which is important to be done in the society."

This new "church" as it formed and grew would always then divide itself into smaller units. They did not form Bible studies or prayer groups, although they did study the Bible to find its truth for them and they prayed to be in God's will. They formed into units that met a particular need of the city. One began a coffee shop. One created a ten bed dispensary that met the needs of the poor. Each little group, 6-8 persons, found a need and met it in Christ.

The needs of our society are nearly infinite. How will we meet them?

Poke Run Fall Fun Day at Gearhard Farms! Don't miss another opportunity for Fun and be sure to invite Friends!




Do you play a musical instrument and can occasionally support Worship music with that talent? See Sean or Pastor Pete—it would be GLORIOUS to have you!





'God's blessing': Murrysville family farm pre-dates America

"It doesn't matter where I live right now — this is home," Chicke said. There's a lot of pride, knowing our family roots."

In the farm's earliest days, Robert Hays would host the occasional church service for a congregation that still exists today, at Poke Run Presbyterian Church in Washington Township.

"A lot of the church family names are part of our genealogy," Gearhard said.

The upper branches of the Gearhard family tree include plenty of names familiar to longtime residents: Hays, Gillespie, Elwood, Rubright, Steele.

"It's mind-boggling when you start to think about all the connections," Gearhard said.
