New Ways of Reading

As Christians we base our faith on the Bible. Since we base our faith on the Bible we need to know what the Bible says to us. To know what the Bible says we not only have to read it, but we must have a strategy for reading and also for understanding what we read. I am going to suggest one strategy for reading the Bible that you may not have thought of, reading the Bible from the end to the beginning. This can be done by reading the last book of the Bible first, then the one before that and then the one before that and so on. This will take you from the book of Revelation to the book of Genesis.

What can be gained from reading backwards? Well, for one thing it is like reading a modern mystery story, or watching a detective show on TV. In a detective story or show you know from the beginning what the crime is. What you want to discover is the why and the how and the who. So if you begin reading Scripture at the end, you already know all of this; you know the ending. When you read in reverse, you know where you have been and it is often easier to piece the entire story together.

It also helps us to understand God in very different ways than the ancient writers understood God. We begin to read God's story from the side of unconditional love. We already know the story of Jesus and his sacrificial love. It helps us to know that we are not being left in the violence and bloodshed of so many of the first Scripture's sagas. It moves us out of archaic and mythological understandings into the loving arms of a forgiving God. It helps us to understand and be gentler with the writers and scribes of the Old Testament period, knowing that they were bound by their own time and worldview. This helps us to see that they wrote to us about God in the only ways that they could. They, like us, can perceive and explain "God" only partially.

After having read "backwards" for a time we may begin to see that the Bible takes us on a journey from Creation to New Creation. Knowing that all the time God intends for we humans to live in a perfect world, which at the current time is a little disorganized, can help us to know where we are going and how. The when is left open. Let's see how this works. We will read first in the normal way, from front to back, and then reverse the process to see how it can give us a better feel for what Scripture is doing.

Back in Leviticus 21:19-21 there is this statement: (Look here http://www.biblegateway.com/passage/?search=Leviticus+21:19-21&version=NIV for this Scripture) A short version is, "No eunuch shall ever enter the assembly of the Lord." Too bad ... if you read on you will discover that no foreigner will ever enter the assembly of the Lord either; so much for Ruth and many of the women in Jesus' lineage. The main point here is that eunuchs and foreigners are forbidden to serve in God's house.

Now let's jump to Isaiah. 56:3-5, (Look here http://www.biblegateway.com/passage/?search=Isaiah+56:3-5&version=NIV for this Scripture.) Foreigners and eunuchs are not only welcome but prolific. This is a clear change of focus. This is also a much wider view of God's all-encompassing love. The more moderate and progressive minds of Israel begin to see that God has more in store than had been previously imagined.

The third passage to look at is in Acts 8:26-40. Look here http://www.biblegateway.com/passage/?search=Acts%208:26-40&version=NIV for this Scripture.) We discover here that one of the very first converts to Christianity is, of all people, a eunuch, and also a foreigner. What in the world is God up to here?




