#### From Pastor Pete

What did you get for Christmas last year or the year before that? Unless the gift, or gifts, was extraordinary or shocking or very expensive and unexpected, you probably can't remember. All our Christmas gifts for which we wait with anticipation, year by year, quickly fade into the background of vesterday.

This year's Christmas is well underway. The giftgiving season now extends from the weeks before Halloween, which is rapidly becoming one of the biggest holidays of the year, reaches a peak on black Friday, and ends with a whimper sometime around New Year. By New Year's Day gifts have been given and exchanged. Life returns to its normal patterns. Christmas lies forgotten in the past. Advent changes all that. Advent proposes a counter to "the Christmas Season." Advent surprises us with a radical reversal of all that the world of stores and toys and presents uses to entice us to buy and to have and to forget. Santa's world arrives and we receive presents because we are good. Christ arrives to remind us that the world is a difficult and dangerous place that needs redemption. Advent leads us to reflect upon what it means that

God became human. Here are three reasons why Advent tells a new and different story that we will not here in the jingles of advertising.

1. Advent-time subverts the dominant culture of self -gratification. During Christmas time advertisers will fill our homes with solutions to every problem we can imagine and some that we cannot. All advertising works pretty much the same. A problem is proposed or shown, say unmanageable hair. A solution is given. Buy and use this product, the ad claims, and you will never have frizzy hair again. In fact, you will have the most beautiful hair in the entire world and all your problems will be solved. In advertising instant gratification of a perceived or created need is the name of the game and it works. Our whole culture buys into it. Reality says that this is a false way of life. The truly valuable things in life take a long time to form, like character. To become a person of character, to build honesty, integrity, and fidelity into a person takes a long time. It is a lifetime effort. Advent goes farther. Advent calls us to wait for God to come to us. Advent calls us to put aside our own wishes and seek the coming promise of God. Advent stands against a Christmas-time culture. The gift of Christ's coming is in future time. And so we wait.

2. Advent anticipates the

coming of God into the world of humanity. God comes into the world in three primary ways. The first way occurred long ago when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea. Only a few participants in God's plan saw or knew anything of His coming. They were odd persons all of them, a young girl, a few shepherds, and magi, whoever magi were, all part of the even more ancient plot that Isaiah and the Hebrew Scriptures kept afloat. Christ will come again at the end of time, a day unknown. When first he came he was judged. When he comes this second time he will judge. (A paraphrase, I believe, of Augustine.) The world is hardly ready and cares less for this second coming. We need a new Isaiah or John the Baptist to call us to repentance. The third way in which Christ comes into the world is by entering into the hearts of individual believers, something that, I trust, we have all experienced. For us in our time Christ's coming to us is the primary experience of God with us.

3. Advent calls us to think deeply about who we are before God. Advent challenges us to step back from our daily lives and take time in prayer and to sit before our God and wait. It must have been deeply disturbing to Mary to be called to bear the Christ child. "How can this be" she wondered even as she accepted the gift. "Behold. I am the servant of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word." When God calls us to a seemingly impossible task, let us be as willing as Mary to accept

God's gift. We wait for the redemption of this world, our own world, as God calls us to witness to it. Who are we in God's eves?

As Christians we are always Advent people. We wait with anticipation for God to step into our lives. We wait for God's gift of salvation, a very different gift than the ones of Christmas time and advertiser's pleas. We hope for the return of Christ and a time of cataclysmic change in the world order. We open our lives to the will of God. We wait.


**Circle 4** will meet on Thursday, December 12 at noon. The hostess is Emma Dunmire and the leader is Mary Ellen Ross.


