Reading Letters from New Testament Times

From Pastor Pete

We write letters for all sorts of reasons. We do not write them as often as we used to, but most of us still write and receive letters of various sorts. The form may have changed from paper to email or text messages. We still write letters. We write them to keep in touch. We write them to ask for information. We write them, hopefully, to correct problems. We write them, or send cards, to congratulate, to praise, or sometimes to complain. We write letters and post cards and texts and emails in order to communicate something of importance to us to another person in hopes that they will respond in some way. Perhaps we wish an answer; perhaps we hope that the letter will bring a smile, evoke a memory, or calm a fear. We may wish to gently right a wrong, or re-connect with someone, or, we may just wish to reach out in some manner. For whatever reason we write letters with some purpose in mind.

That is exactly the case in the New Testament. The letters are occasional. That is, the writers of the letters that we read in the Bible wrote them for some particular purpose. Something has occurred that they wish to address; an occasion has arisen which they feel needs immediate attention. The man we call Paul of Tarsus, or just Paul wrote the majority of these letters. A few were written by the apostle Peter, some by John one by James, and a couple more by persons unknown. And of course it wouldn't be biblical scholarship if there were not a few over which we fight to determine just who did write them. In each case however, they are responding to a need discerned within the community to which they write.

When we read the biblical letters we only have one side of the conversation. Herein lies the challenge that goes with understanding them. We must place them into the proper context.

Sometimes this is easy to do. Often it is not. Reading these letters is something like listening to one side of a telephone conversation. We can hear only a part of the conversation. If we are familiar with the topic, we can understand more easily. Often the conversation drifts into areas where we are unfamiliar and we get lost. The New Testament letters are the same way. When Paul discusses family relations it may not be too difficult to follow. What, we wonder, does eating meat offered to idols have to do with apps on Iphones. To discover this, we have to read with discernment. It takes some digging and some Spiritual insight and some prayer. Sometimes we still don't get it and we have to put it away for a while. One of the great Doctors of the Church, whom some have said had the greatest mind of all history, was stuck for years on a passage in one of these letters. We can expect to struggle with them from time to time. That's OK, struggling with Scripture is good.

Remember too, the letters were written to be understood. The first people to hear them as someone read to the gathered community, say the church at Corinth, knew what they meant. Thus we too can read them with this in mind. They are not meant to be deep or dark or mysterious. Quite the contrary, they were meant to clear things up, to be helpful, and to open new possibilities for faith. We, just like these ancient and newly formed churches, should gather around and hear them as if for the first time. Then we should puzzle them out together. Often when communities do this one or more persons is illuminated and sees right through to the heart of the letter. Then we know more than what Paul or Peter or James or John said to their churches, we know what God says to us.

The letters were intended to address a problem and effect a change. Without the intended change they are just interesting artifacts of antiquity. Read simply as ancient correspondence from which we can discover the social positions of early Christians, or some other such irrelevant information, they are lost to us. They have lost their usefulness as guides to living a rich Christian life. This is why we should struggle with them together, and learn from them how Christ is formed in us and transforms us and many other mysteries that are revealed through them. Just because there are parts of them that are difficult does not mean that there are not concepts that we can easily understand and begin to live so that our lives are transformed, as the lives of the early Christians were transformed, into the image of Christ.
