I am going to talk today first about a system of thought, or belief, called "Calvinism." As we have received it, it is a harsh and unforgiving framework. Unfortunately it has been used, unfairly I believe, to caricature John Calvin, the great sixteenth century Reformer from the writings of whom, among others, the present form of our Reformed faith has emerged. Then, I am going to challenge this miserable system with quotes from Calvin's own works and show that his thought was much broader than five simple statements can grasp. I will close with a comment or two about Calvin the person and his life.

You may have heard of the acronym TULIP. TULIP is a shortened form of what is called five point Calvinism. We receive it from The Synod of Dort which met during the years 1618-19 in order to attempt to settle a major dispute going on in the churches. Fancy that! Here are the five points:

<u>T</u>otal Depravity – or, all human beings are so totally depraved and under the control of sin that they cannot of their own free will choose not to sin. Or, everything that we do is somehow tinged with sin. This means as well that we cannot possibly save ourselves.

<u>Unconditional election</u> – God chooses us for reasons of God's own. God's choice is not dependent upon anything we are or have done. We do not get to choose, God does. This has the unfortunate effect that those not elect to salvation are automatically elect to damnation. This is known as double predestination. (Yes, some people actually believe this.)

<u>L</u>imited atonement – only a few, a given number known only to God are

chosen. Some gentler souls have suggested that perhaps this number is infinite.

<u>I</u>rresistible grace – those chosen by God cannot resist his grace; you cannot choose to walk away from election.

<u>Perseverance</u> of the saints – those so chosen are chosen for eternity.

This my friends, is so-called raw Calvinism. Some of our brothers and sisters on the conservative side of the Reformed Church hold to these beliefs with great fervor. Some have modified them; some are not "five" but "three point" Calvinists, or "three and a half," and so on. Churches outside the Reformed faith do not agree with much of any of it.

But is this what Calvin himself taught? I will list some quotes that I have taken directly from his Commentary on the Four Gospels. Here is one: "God invites all indiscriminately to salvation through the gospel ... (his message) has reference to the whole human race." What do you think? Was Calvin a Calvinist? Not likely. One quote is hardly sufficient; consider this, " ... he (Christ) is never sought in vain by those who desire to know him." And then this remarkable statement rendered in his handling of Peter's misunderstanding of the Transfiguration, pushing the limits of universalism, " ... what if Christ had been confined ... to the narrow limits of twenty or thirty (persons)? ... Where would have been the redemption of the whole world? Where would have been the communication of eternal salvation?" If that does not do it for us, this is even more remarkable: "Those who infer ... that faith is a gift of God are mistaken; for Christ does not show what God produces in us, but what God requires from us."

Yes, Calvin taught "Election" or predestination, but he taught in a highly nuanced form. Calvin was one of the great intellects of the world, past or present, and he could easily work with paradox.



He taught what Scripture said in any instance and held this whole complex teaching in his spacious mind.

Calvin was trained, not as clergy but as a lawyer. His academic dissertation was not on a theological topic but on Seneca, an early pagan politician and philosopher who followed Greek Stoic thought and some would say expanded and bettered it. One of my professors at seminary, Charles Partee stated that Calvin read Seneca every day of his life up until the very day he died. By some counts Calvin quotes from over 120 different nonbiblical writers in his first great work, the Institutes of the Christian Religion. Many of these writers were pagan philosophers and many were persons with whom Calvin disagrees but finds their thought invigorating as well as provoking.

We know very little about Calvin's personal life. His letter written to a friend on the death of Calvin's wife is touching. Of his conversion we know less, except that it turned him into a servant of God like no other. In his later days he was sickly. He couldn't sleep so he studied and wrote. He preached, while ill, until he coughed up blood and was forced to stop. Occasionally in a sermon, taken down in shorthand by a faithful follower, one finds, "I can go not farther, " as the last words.

What we know is that we cannot restrict the thought of this great servant of God to five points.


