"... then his brother's wife shall go up to him in the presence of the elders and pull his sandal off his foot and spit in his face. And she shall answer and say, 'So shall it be done to the man who does not build up his brother's house.' And the name of his house shall be called in Israel, 'The house of him who had his sandal pulled off.' " (Deuteronomy 25:9-10)

OK! So What?

The Bible is full of these kinds of weird, confusing, and unintelligible stories, quotes, and scenes.

OK, so what?

That just seems all the more reason not to read it, much less spend a lot of time studying it. When it comes to "Bible Study" we begin with at least two strikes, the word "Bible" which brings forth all kinds of images, like the confusing quote above. The Bible itself seems ancient and irrelevant in today's world. The second strike is the word "study." Our school experiences have molded us into people who run from study. Study is hard work. And it takes time, and time is something we would rather give to other more exciting pass times.

Still, I think a case can be made for "Bible Study." I will lay out three primary reasons and one derivative reason for spending time in Scripture with other people. I hope to show that there are rich rewards for those persons who put some energy into these ancient texts. There is more there than meets the eye. Like the oceans of the world, more lies beneath the surface than upon it.

First of all we have been given a fascinating book. I will agree that much of it seems at first obscure but that is its draw. What at first seems to be mysterious and foreign slowly comes to life as we sit with it and let it reveal its message to us. Some of its stories are downright amusing, some are violent, some are sexy, and some still baffle us. Some we may never unravel. We may never understand them. It is like a dearly loved spouse. We know much, yet, there is much we do not know, and much we will never know. Human beings are much too deep to fully comprehend. The same can be said of Scripture, which from time to time exposes the mind of God through the minds of its human writers. The more we learn the more curious we become and the more we comprehend. It becomes a circular quest that spirals into infinity.

Secondly, there is the intellectual challenge. Oh, I know, you had enough of that in school, or at work, or in raising children. All of us though thrive on puzzles. We are incurably curious and find a degree of happiness in solving mysteries. If you are still alive you know this. I am not talking about gaining knowledge or adding a few facts to your brain. I am looking at this like a kind of mental exercise that can gently awaken you to new ways of thinking and being in the world which are invigorating. When you figure out what these crazy people were up too, and some of them are certifiably insane, and all of them are selfish and crafty and ego centered, then a light comes on. This is something you must experience for yourself.

Finally, the first two reasons lead to a hidden wisdom that comes with time -- time spent puzzling over the rambling and chaotic words of Scripture and suddenly seeing the big picture. God is gracious, infinitely gracious. Judgment flows into grace and grace wins. This opens to you a life that is filled with love and hope, replacing anxiety and fear.

I said that there was one derivative reward from studying Scripture. In this time when people communicate primarily by text, electronically, when two people can be in the same room and never speak a word to each other, we need to reconnect, speaking face to face. This can happen when we sit together and read and discuss and challenge and support each other in what we naively call "Bible Study" but is so much more. Gathered in the presence of God we come into fuller fellowship with each other and the Divine.


