### From Pastor Pete

God is triune. God is a Trinity. God is three in one. People say, "I don't understand this," or "What difference does it make?" It makes all the difference in the world. Here is another statement I hear all the time, "We all believe in the same God." What is being asserted is, "So, we're all OK, right." I'll be quite simple and blunt. "No, we are not all OK." What we believe and who we believe in is more than a matter of life and death. It is a matter of eternal life and eternal death.

Let's talk about God and beliefs in God. Some people believe that there is no God, no gods, and no spiritual dimension to life. What you see is all there is, all there ever has been or will be, and it has always been here. They have no theory or philosophy of beginnings. They cannot and will not explain how "all there is" came to be. Then there are various versions of the philosopher's god, a god who is an abstract force, a set of cosmic laws, or a first principle. This god has little or nothing to do with the day -to-day operations of the Universe or human life, makes no demands on us morally or otherwise. This

version of god is quite convenient and innocuous, not really a god at all. Others, especially philosophically minded theologians believe that God is simple, or that God is a unity. I am not quite sure where they are going with that. We can work our way through all the religious systems claiming that God is ultimate being, the ground of all being, the void, that there are multiple sub gods, and so on. It seems that there is a god for almost anyone and to suit any purpose, and that is part of the problem. All these gods are constructions of the human imagination.

None of these gods is the one triune God revealed in the Bible containing the Old and New Testaments. None of these gods is a God who brings salvation to humanity by personally taking on their sin and sins. None of these gods wishes to come into communion and union with human beings through their faith in

Christ. That is because none of them can. Most of them are imaginary and the rest are very poor

and incomplete mental constructs of the one true God.

How then are we to understand this Trinitarian God? Amazingly I found the simplest explanation coming from Karl Barth. Barth is usually extremely difficult to unravel. Here he is at his simplest and perhaps best. "... it follows from the Trinitarian God revealed in Scripture that this one God is not just to be understood as impersonal lordship, i.e. as power, but as the Lord, not just as absolute Spirit but as person, i.e. as an I existing in and for itself with its own thought and will. This is how he meets us in his revelation." His revelation is the man Jesus of Nazareth, or Jesus Christ. "This is how he is thrice God as Father, Son, and Spirit."

It is because God is Lord that He commands us to live a holy and moral life. It is because God is a person that God enters into relationships of love with us. It is because God is Son that God saves us from our sin. Without this view of

God we have no God at all, no salvation, and no hope. It is the triune God who creates and redeems and sustains.

To be a Christian is to say with Paul in Galatians, "I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me."

Knowing the triune God is more than important, it is ultimate.






