I will open with a quote from Brene Brown. It may well be that she sums up all I will say in wisdom we can understand and use in our daily lives.

“Don’t try to win over the haters. You are not a jackass whisperer.”

This is one of those mornings when I woke up energized and alert just before 5AM. I have no idea why I feel so particularly good today. Perhaps it is because I ate no carbohydrates yesterday. More likely it is one of those rare gifts of grace that God bestows upon us from time to time. What is odd is that with all this energy, I have no particular sense that I ought to be doing anything. Maybe that is part of the gift. This is a good time to ponder the workings of the Universe or some other mystery of life.

Speaking of Universe and mystery, the philosopher Charles Taylor has written a large, very large actually, volume that he titled, A Secular Age. I have not read all of it, and I may never read all of it. What I have read intrigues me. Taylor traces what he believes are the social and religious forces that brought our western world to where it is today. He does not think that we just made a big jump, say from the 1960’s to our now seemingly chaotic time. He feels that it all began in the 1500’s with the Protestant Reformation. This means it took us 500 hundred years to get here. Perhaps, in another five hundred years we may know for sure.

What most catches my attention though is his argument that we see our world in entirely different ways from the people who lived in past times. People living in earlier ages believed that the Cosmos, not the Universe as we know it, was quite small and limited. The spiritual forces in which they believed, demons, goblins, gods and God, existed right along with them and sometimes lived within them. It was, in a sense,

as if one lived inside a great dome with everything kind of smashed together. What one person did in this system impacted everyone else in the system.

Now, we know, due to the Hubble telescope, just how huge the universe is. We also know that there is a pretty significant slice of the universe that we cannot yet see because the light from it has not arrived yet. This means that we have nothing but guesses about what may be out there. We current moderns live not in a closed cosmos but in an open universe that is expanding. And, it is colossal, huge beyond what we can even think. Demons, ghosts, and hobgoblins exist, if we believe in them at all, outside of us and completely separate from us. Oddly, in this massive open universe, we believe that everything exists within our heads, in our thoughts, in our minds, which means that our brains control everything. What is real is what we know and believe and is a function of our brain. In our world we are all isolated from each other.

Here’s the rub. All our religions emerged when people believed in a limited closed universe. Our Bible, along with the Koran, the Vedas, the great Buddhist writings, and all the rest of our major religious books, come from ancient times. This makes them often seem very strange to us. There is one thing however that sets the Bible apart. I agree with the theologian John Webster. In the Bible we have the writings that God set apart to tell us who God is and how God acts and has acted in the world for our redemption. This makes the Bible a book for all times. Its writings reveal to us God as Jesus Christ, God in, with, and among us. They show us a unique way of life. They tell us that we are called into this life to be a blessing to this world in this time and in this place. To be salt and light, even to the “jackasses.” That – is quite a challenge.

Now, back to reading Charles Taylor, or just watching the snow fall, or in the universe as we know it, where snow doesn’t fall, gravity pulls it towards the earth. I can give you the mathematical formula if you wish. There is no up to fall from, except as we define it. No god hurls lightning bolts; it’s all about electrical forces ... rather bland is it not. Maybe, even in this universe, we are called to be “jackass whisperers.”

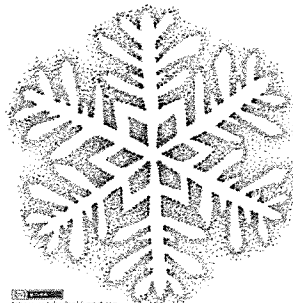

Cool Down for Warmth

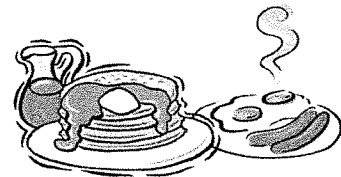

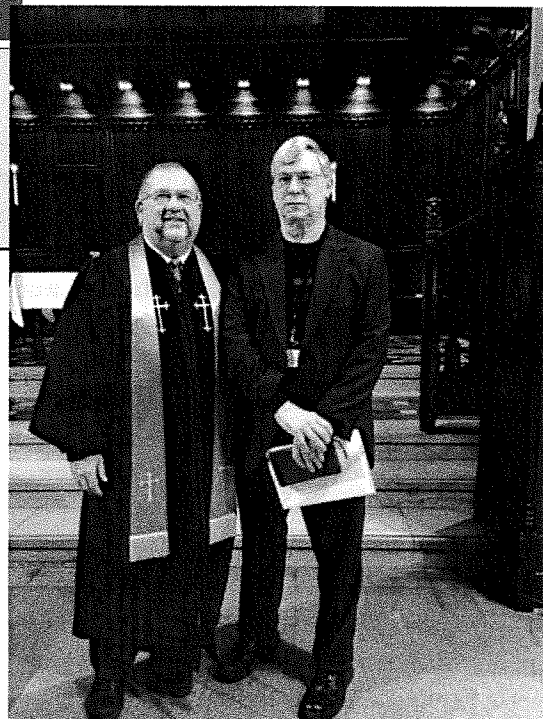
"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. (John 3:16)

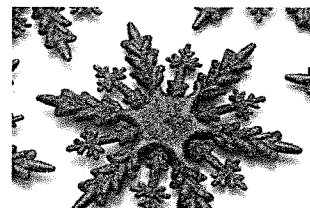
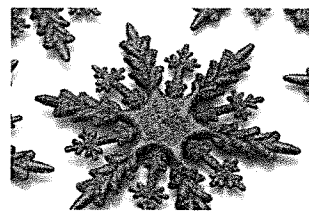
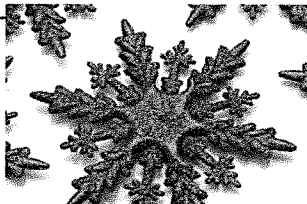
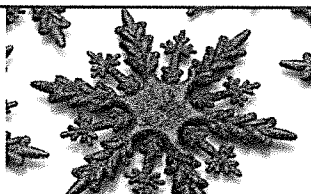
Pete believes that our faith is not something private or reduced to a set of beliefs, but a life that displays the truth of Christ and brings healing to those who are hurting.

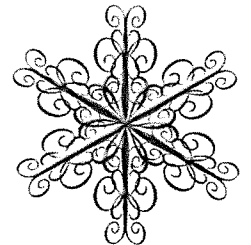

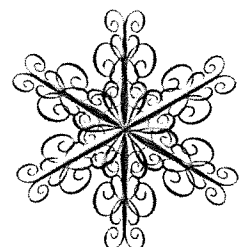
He replied, "I ate potato chips in the park with God." However, before his son responded, he added, "He's much younger than I expected."
