Here is one of my favorite Old Testament stories. You can read the whole story in 2 Kings 6:11-23. Or you can read it here: <https://www.biblegateway.com/passage/?search=2+kings+6&version=ESV> It is not necessary to read it to follow this essay.

Imagine waking up one morning to the sound of neighing horses, clanking armor, and shouted military orders. Once you have convinced yourself that you did not leave the TV on all night or that you did not fall asleep hooked into your PlayStation you look outside. There really is an army milling around in your front yard, thousands of soldiers with spears and bows and arrows. There really are horses, some with riders and some pulling chariots. The shouts are real. They are not happy and you are the reason for their anger.

OK, it is hard if not impossible to imagine being surrounded by an ancient Syrian army. It is not hard to imagine being surrounded by enough problems or challenges so that it seems like several regiments of hostile troops surround you. Working Moms know exactly what I am talking about. So do working Dads. So do people who suddenly find out that what they thought was a cold is something much worse. So do all of us coping with aging, our own, our parents, our friends, or our spouse. It could be a day when the pipes freeze, the car won't start, the cell phone battery dies, and the smoke alarm begins to beep. Each of these usually happens within minutes of the other. Violent pagan armies ready to attack us abound, everything from microbes to maniacs surrounds us.

The prophet Elisha was one morning awakened to the noises of a hostile Syrian army just outside his door. His servant looks out and says, "Alas master, what shall we do?" He (Elisha) said, "Do not be afraid for those who are with us are more than those who are with them." Then Elisha prayed and said, "O Lord, please open his eyes that he may see." So the Lord opened the eyes of the young man, and he saw, and behold the mountain was full of horses and chariots of fire all around Elisha.

Note, Elisha does not pray for the divine army of horses and chariots of fire to come to his rescue. They are already there. He prays for the young man, his servant, to see what already exists. I think that there is a lesson here. When we find ourselves overwhelmed we tend to pray for divine intervention. Like the ballad of a few years back, 1978 actually, that chronicles the adventures of a young man who claims that innocently he went home with a waitress who it turns out is "with the Russians too." He calls Dad for "lawyers, guns, and money" ... "to get me out of this," we call out to God to remove the problems. Rather, like Elisha, when surrounded by evil, everything from hyper-business to devastating illness, we should pray for the inner vision to see that God has already surrounded us with "horses and chariots of fire." God is with us, always.

Now we have discussed one subtlety in the story, how does it end? Elisha is in the center, surrounded by a foreign army which itself is ringed by flaming horses and chariots. Does God come thundering in to save Elisha? No, Elisha prays again, and not for the destruction of the army, but for its blindness. The end result of Elisha's prayers and actions is that the entire Syrian army stands helpless before the King of Israel. Here is where it gets interesting.

The King of Israel asks Elisha, "Shall I strike them down?" Elisha answers, "You shall not strike them down...set bread and water before them..." so he (the king) prepared for them a great feast.

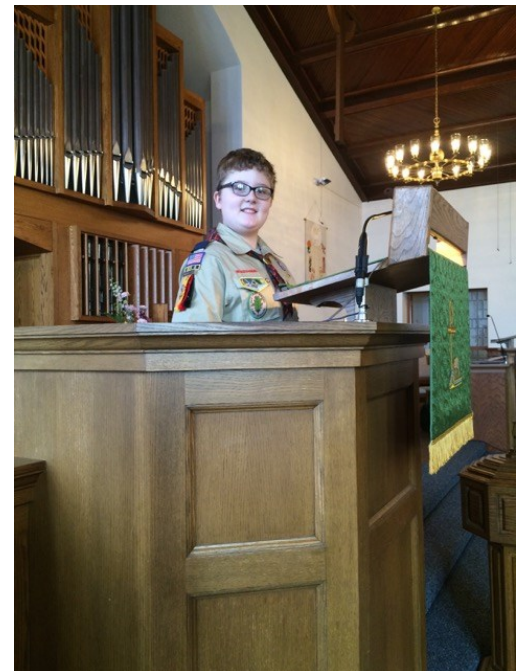
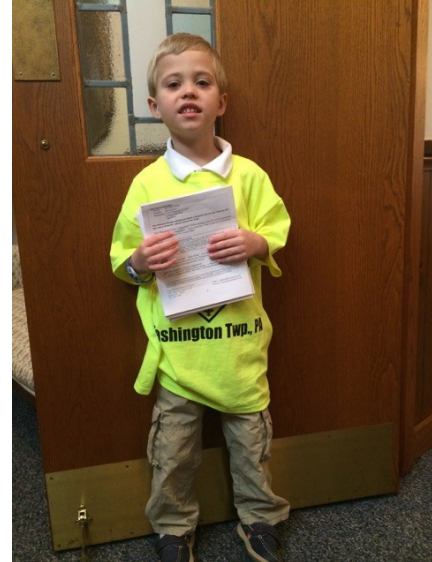

RE. Background Check (paid and volunteers) and mandatory reporting on child abuse**Date January 8, 2015.**

As a result of Act 153 of 2014 Pennsylvania General Assembly, it is important that each congregation that has a ministry program (s) that involves children and youth become familiar with the new law pertaining to child abuse. Among other items, requirements for background clearances are specified both in expanding the definition of employees and inclusion of volunteers having “direct contact with children. “

The above excerpt is from a letter that we recently received from the Presbytery. It is very timely because the Personnel Committee was tasked this year to create an abuse policy. The idea was first originated to us by our insurer, and we felt it important that having a standard policy would assure parents that we provide a safe environment for their children. Currently there are two reports that all individuals that are involved with any program involving children must complete. (1) Pennsylvania Criminal History Report and (2) the Child Abuse History Clearance Report. A third report needs to be completed if the individual has not lived in the state of Pennsylvania for the last 10 years. If you have been a resident in the state for over 10 years then a signed notarized affidavit is sufficient.

Although we can all agree that obtaining these reports may be an inconvenience, the reality in today's world is that we all understand the need to provide a safe environment for children. The Personnel Committee is working on some options to help ease the process along with possible reimbursement for the fees that are required when applying for the reports. We also are speaking to the Presbytery to stay updated on this process, along with attending a class conducted by our insurer so that we are educated on this process.

Many congregation members may have the clearances due to their current or past work related positions. If this is the case, and you regularly participate with our TGIF or VBS programs, we ask that you gather your reports and provide a copy to our office. Over the next month, someone from the Personnel Committee may be contacting you and ask if you can get the clearances if you have volunteered in the past. If anyone has any questions or concerns, please contact any member of the Personnel Committee. We look forward to ensuring a safe environment for our children's programs here at Poke Run Church.

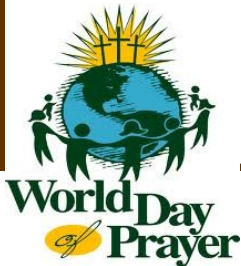

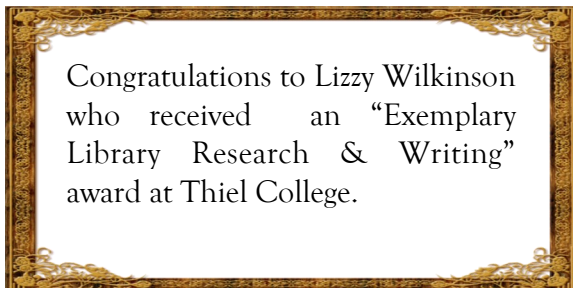
