from Pastor Pete

" I believe that I have no prejudices whatsoever. All I need to know is that a (person) is a member of the human race. That's bad enough for me. " Mark Twain

"In the beginning ... " Genesis is such a hard book for us. I have no idea why. It is a simple story. Perhaps that is our first clue. It is a story. Why story. Stories are perhaps the best vehicles for conveying truth. The better the story, the greater the truth it can carry. Jokes and humor may be a close second. They often catch us unawares and reveal a great deal for us or about us. After all, the jokes we laugh at can show both our values and uncertainties. But enough of jokes, let's take a look at Genesis, in particular the Adam and Eve story, for it points us to the Truth, who is Jesus Christ our Lord.

Briefly. to orient us, God tells Adam and Eve they can eat from any tree but one. Being so very human they immediately eat from the forbidden tree. God explodes in anger. God curses Eve and Adam and the tricky talking snake. The snake may lose the most for he loses his legs and voice. Now he - how come our feminist friends do not complain about the evil snake being a he? - must crawl about on his belly and is limited to a hiss. God throws Adam and Eve out of the garden never to come back. That is why women have pain in childbirth and men have to work and sweat and snakes have no legs. That, my friends, is both an extremely literal and figurative reading of the Adam/Eve story.

How do we know that God is angry? Suppose God is sad? Suppose God realizes that Adam and Eve have crossed a line that forever fractures the trust that people must have to allow for the evolution of deep and lasting friendship? Suppose this hurts God deeply. He can no longer trust Eve and Adam nor any of their descendents. "Adam, what have you done," is pronounced with profound pathos. And yet, while we may not be faithful, God is. God accepts the reality of who we now are, and God prepares us for the world to come. It is true; Eden no longer exists and never will. God then clothes us and sends us out into a new world. This tells us a wonderful truth about an ever-faithful God.

Another way to read this story is to see it as a story of growing up. In this reading God knows all along that we will one day push our limits. We do. God is pleased that we are now willing to grow and test our abilities, knowing that at times we would make poor decisions and fail. We have become mature adults, or, at least adolescents. Here God is more of a risk taker. He gives freedom and allows us to take risks also.

There are other readings of this story. If we take modern scholarship at face value and accept a late writing of this story, then Eve and Adam are Israel, seeking help from other nations, sometimes even worshipping their gods. It explains the Exile.

Which story is true? Are all of them true? Genesis is simple, right? We are so hung up on picking at irrelevant details that we miss the Truth. We should be careful before making bold truth claims.

Now we jump ahead six thousand or two thousand five hundred years, pick your starting point after having examined all the evidence and taken a good look at your prejudices, agendas, beliefs, and history as a human being. In a day or so, Jesus will be crucified. On the cross Jesus cries out, "Father forgive them for they know not what they do." What an amazing cry. Look around. You will see the soldiers who drove the nails into his hands and feet, who handled him roughly as if he were nothing at all. He calls for their forgiveness. There are those who curse him, who make fun of him, who deride him and all the good he has done. He calls for their forgiveness. There are those who have abandoned him. They too fall under the call for forgiveness, as do a few women who stand at the cross. You and I, we too receive forgiveness.

This is not a story. This is history. Now let's take this historical event and use it as a lens for interpreting the Adam/Eve story. This way it lets us see that our second interpretation of the Adam/Eve story points us to the deepest truth. We fracture our relationship with God. But God is faithful, always. God is love. Love never fails, never. God is always the faithful partner, always, even when hanging on a cross. God's ultimate act is to love us. forever. It's simple, really.




