The Bible, I claim, has one unified message. That message is, speaking broadly, God has created and redeemed the world through Jesus Christ. You might wonder how a book such as the Bible crafted over a period of 1400 years through the minds of many writers could sustain just one main theme. I am not going to tackle so large a topic in this one short essay. Instead I am going to trace just one sub-theme to give you an indication how the Bible sticks together. I will do this through four verses of Scripture, two from the Old Testament and two from the New Testament. The sub-theme we will follow is the image of a river.

In Genesis 2:10 we read, "A river flowed out of Eden to water the garden, and there it divided and became four rivers." Remember the context of the Bible. It is written to a desert people in a dry, arid land. There wasn't much water. Water is life giving; water is a necessity. A river flowing out of a garden is an image of abundant life, health, and well-being. Note that the river flows out of Eden. The life giving water of this river is not restricted to the garden alone but is full and rich enough to become four great rivers watering the lands surrounding Eden. Two of the rivers exist today, the Tigris and the Euphrates, still flowing and still bringing life. This is a first great image of God providing life for all peoples.

Jump forward now several thousand biblical years into the time of the prophet Ezekiel. Towards the end of the book attributed to him a river flows, "water... from below the threshold of the temple..." Ezekiel sees in this great vision the beginnings of a great river flowing from God's

temple. He is led into this flowing water for 1000 cubits, about 1500 feet, and the water was ankle deep. He was led another 1000 cubits and the water was knee deep, and so on, until, "it was deep enough to swim in, a river that could not be passed through." The picture expands. Trees grow along the banks with fruit for food and leaves for healing; fish are caught in the waters. Another great image of health and healing lies before us, another gift from God.

A third river flows. (Revelation 22:1-4) "Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, bright as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb." The first two rivers are imperfect, wonderful but limited. This river flows, "through the middle of the street of the city (the new Jerusalem) ... on either side of the river the tree of life ... for the healing of the nations ... " This picture concludes the great vision of John the seer of Patmos and gives us a glimpse of eternity. The river heals eternally.

These are images, pictures in words. The image is not the reality. What we are after is the reality behind the picture. A pastor in Germany during WW II tells the story of coming home to find his children licking the pictures of food in a catalogue. They were that hungry. The pictures did not nourish them. They were not food. We need the reality behind the pictures. That reality is Christ. Christ is the life giving water that nourishes our eternal souls and saves us for eternal life. Christ is God proceeding from God, the eternal river of life offered to us for our salvation.

Now let's push that image a bit further. With echoes of Eden and Ezekiel of a richly flowing river we can read Acts 1:8. "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be witnesses to me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of

the earth." This gives us a new image, an ever flowing, healing river of the witness to Jesus Christ by his church, beginning at home, ever growing, ever expanding, for the eternal healing of the world.

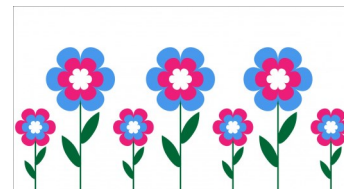

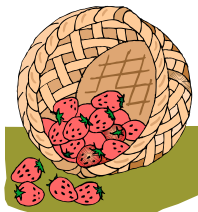

RE. Background Check (paid and volunteers) and mandatory reporting on child abuse
Date January 8, 2015. IMPORTANT FOR VBS AND MISSION TRIP VOLUNTEERS

As a result of Act 153 of 2014 Pennsylvania General Assembly, it is important that each congregation that has a ministry program (s) that involves children and youth become familiar with the new law pertaining to child abuse. Among other items, requirements for background clearances are specified both in expanding the definition of employees and inclusion of volunteers having “direct contact with children. “

The above excerpt is from a letter that we recently received from the Presbytery. Currently there are two reports that all individuals that are involved with any program involving children must complete. (1) Pennsylvania Criminal History Report and (2) the Child Abuse History Clearance Report. A third report needs to be completed if the individual has not lived in the state of Pennsylvania for the last 10 years. If you have been a resident in the state for over 10 years then a signed notarized affidavit is sufficient.

The Session has approved that Poke Run will pay for the necessary clearances for our volunteers. Many congregation members may have the clearances due to their current or past work related positions. If this is the case, and you regularly participate with our TGIF or VBS programs, we ask that you gather your reports and provide a copy to our office.

You can apply for these on your own and submit a receipt for reimbursement , or you can make an appointment with Amy Wilkinson in the office utilizing the Office computer. Amy has designated the following times or by special appointment. **Friday, May 8, 9am-3pm, Wednesday, May 13, 3-6pm and Wednesday, May 27, 6-9pm.**

If anyone has any questions or concerns, please contact any member of the Personnel Committee. Amy can help you with the online applications. We look forward to ensuring a safe environment for our children's programs here at Poke Run Church.

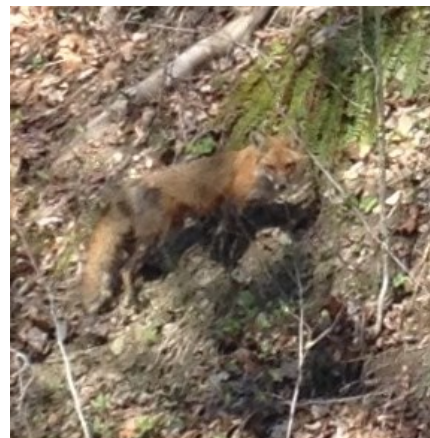
