

Redstone Mission Team Restores Hurricane Damaged Homes

Eighteen volunteers from West Newton, Congruity, Community, Uniontown, Westminster, Avonmore, Harmony, and Maplewood churches cleared out a basement, finished drywall, installed cabinets and leveled floors in homes devastated by Hurricane Sandy.

Many of these same volunteers had traveled to help on previous trips starting after Katrina hit New Orleans in 2005.



Months of work ahead on Route 66

Delays likely during PennDOT's \$2.4M restoration project in Washington Township

Starting Monday, motorists traveling Route 66 in Washington Township might want to allow more time to reach their destination.

That's when a \$2.4 million road restoration project will start on the Alle-Kiski Valley's main route to Greensburg.

According to PennDOT, the project will be along a 1- to 1.5-mile stretch of Route 66 from a point near Walker Road, north of the intersection with Route 366 (Greensburg Road). From there, work will continue south to a point near Mamont Drive, north of where Route 286 crosses Route 66.

All the work will take place within Washington Township.

PennDOT spokeswoman Valerie Petersen said the project will involve a variety of improvements, including repairs to the road base; shoulder reconstruction; milling and resurfacing; tree trimming; minor drainage repair; guardrail replacement; line painting; and sign installation.

The work, which is being done

by Tresco Paving, is expected to be completed by mid-October, Petersen said.

Sections of Route 66 were so badly degraded by severe winter weather that PennDOT had to perform emergency repairs in March

The upcoming project is not a response to that, according to Petersen. She said it had been one of the projects scheduled as part of PennDOT's 12-year road improvement plan.

"There was a lot of damage on that road from the winter, but it was on the plan," said Rich Gardner, Washington Township supervisors chairman.

Petersen said there are no plans to add temporary lanes to maintain two-lane traffic, as is done for some PennDOT projects.

"As of right now, they are going to do it with flaggers who will maintain traffic," she said.

That means that there will be alternating lanes of traffic and delays are likely.

"That's how they did it the last time — and it's definitely an inconvenience for traffic." Gardner said. "That is a busy road."

"It has not been determined if they will be working day or night," Petersen said. "Our interstate projects are done at night, but for other projects, it's up to the contractor."

Gardner said he doesn't expect the project to cause any major problems for businesses since there aren't many in that area. He is glad the work is being done.

"I think it will be good when it is done," he said.


