#### Approaching the Gospel: A Mystery revealed, and still a Mystery From Pastor Pete

For some time now I have been thinking about the Gospel. After all, if it is the good news of salvation, or The Good News of Salvation, or THE GOOD NEWS OF SALVATION, perhaps we should know something about it, or at least honor it with a bit of our free time. And if indeed, as I believe it is, it is the good news of salvation leading to eternal life, well, that is infinitely serious is it not?

First I will tell you of a modern, or rather postmodern, reconstruction of the gospel by a deconstructionist – OK it's time for me to speak more clearly. Peter Rollins tells this story. Once there was a man who followed Jesus right up to the cross. He saw him die. He wept. He turned around and walked away. He decided then and there that Jesus had a vision of life that was greater than anything that he had ever known. He made a vow. He would keep this vision alive. He traveled to a far country. He established a small community living as Jesus had taught. They lived sacrificial lives of love at great cost to themselves. Some of them were martyred because this way of life was so at odds with the world around them. They lived this way for hundreds of years and may be living this way still.

I like this story. I like the idea that we should follow Jesus without regard for

ourselves. I like the greater idea that we should follow Jesus with no thought of reward, and we should. If we follow Jesus with the idea that we will be rewarded for our sacrifices then we have entered into an economic transaction with the divine. I don't like that. Even if we follow Jesus with the thought that it will bring us eternal life, that is a quid pro quo, or something for something, proposition. I like that even less. I believe that we must learn to love God for who God is and follow Jesus for the beauty of his vision. I believe this along with Job. "Though He slay me, I will hope in Him." (Job 13:5 – echoed in Habbakuk3:17-18) The Gospel, the Christian vision of beauty, peace, and love is the only vision of its kind and the only vision that will save humanity, and humans.

I add humans because the above story is not the gospel. The Bible goes out of its way to place the resurrection before us. It is written for us in all four of the gospels. The apostle Paul fairly revels in it. Paul's message revolves around this: "... I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures ... " There is more but here is the heart, he died, was buried, and raised. Without the resurrection

the story collapses. However else we may struggle to define it, the Gospel is an announcement of the "Good News" that God has entered history in Jesus of Nazareth who lived, died, and rose from the dead.

Now comes the even more difficult question of "Why?". Here in extreme brevity are a few incomplete attempts at definition. The Gospel is the message/good news that: God's promises to Israel are fulfilled, the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand, we are saved from the wrath of God, Christ died for your sins, read Paul's definition at Romans 1:1-4, let's see that's five attempts; more exist.

It would be easy to integrate all these into one longer statement. I think it would be a mistake to do that. Rather we are given multiple views of a profound mystery. Each of these views is like a facet on a diamond. As you look through it you see the gem in a new, brilliant, and beautiful way. Turn the diamond to a new facet and you will see revealed more beauty.

We know this. The Gospel occurred in time, in history. The Gospel was and is an act of supreme divine love. The Gospel is for us to show us the depths of God's love. What else is needed, except our loving response?







Clearances for employees need completion by end of year. Volunteers need to be completed by July of 2016.


#### New Business:


