

"News"

Tuesday November 22nd 7:30pm Often you will hear, perhaps on the daily news, or perhaps during the numerous episodes of news commentary, or even in a police report, of a "good Samaritan" stopping to help. Almost everyone in America has some sense of what this means. To be a good Samaritan means to stop and help someone in need, perhaps at some risk or inconvenience to oneself. Yet, when asked where the term originates very few can say decisively that it



comes even from the New Testament; fewer still will know that the story comes from Luke 10. When asked to tell the full story, not many get it right, not many know its nuances. So here is a story embedded deep into the American psyche with its origin in the Bible and impacting our behaviors but of which we know little. Interesting.

Now I am going to explore this idea that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments are somehow "authoritative" for us as Christians. We will begin by considering truth, not as facts but as biblical truth by looking at the crucifixion of Jesus of Nazareth. Next we will look at Scripture not as an object to be studied but as a subject speaking to us. We will follow this by a brief overview of today's needs in relation to the Bible as Scripture, God's Word to us.

Here in America we tend to equate truth with facts, especially facts as validated by science, history, or experience. It may well be that experience carries the most weight for most people. But do facts get us to the truth? Consider the Crucifixion of Jesus of Nazareth. We have the facts of the matter before us. First there is the Christian witness of the four gospels, and the apostle Paul's fabulous witness in his letters. Roman and Jewish sources also exist which validate that one Jesus of Nazareth was crucified on a Roman cross somewhere around 30 CE. Almost no one argues this fact. And, while there are many nuances to their explanations most people will agree on these witnesses that this man Jesus was seen alive and well after this crucifixion. However, for the sake of our argument, let only take the almost indisputable fact that one man, Jesus of Nazareth was crucified two thousand years ago. Knowing this tells us nothing about God's purposes in history through the life and death of Jesus, nor that God becomes human through Jesus' life, nor that this is an event of salvation with universal implications. The truth here lies beyond the facts.

The Bible has become, for a few scholars and fewer Christians, a book to be studied, a document to be perused in order to find historical facts or propositions to be turned into doctrines. A few more try to find the original meaning and somehow catapult it into today's world in some way that is relevant. All these actions tend to turn the Bible into an object, passive and obedient to our manipulations. The book of Hebrews puts it better, "... the word of God is living and active ... " meaning, "Scripture is subject (in the sense of its (ability) ... to speak to and shape us). That is, we go to Scripture, and we read, not to discover more facts, or to disprove what is there, but to listen to the very voice of God speaking to us. If we obey what we hear, we will be transformed.

Now, we Christians of the 21st century and beyond, need to return to the Bible and read it as it was intended to be read. We read in the power and influence of the Holy Spirit with open hearts and curious minds, seeking the truth that is revealed to us within its pages, word by word, phrase by phrase, sentence by sentence. "That is, we need to recover the freedom to engage with ancient texts as our texts, and with respect and expectancy, as those who thus might embrace Scriptures (vision of God) and be molded according to its patterns and life." What is needed most perhaps is to sit down together with friends and new friends and puzzle things out together. We need this not just to discover truth but to become disciples of Jesus who live out our discoveries moment by moment and day by day.

The short way of saying all this is to ask, "What is the Bible saying to us today that we are to do?"

For some, like our "good Samaritans," it is working, whether we know it or not.

Christ at work in our midst

Let the Little Children Come to Me

Serving as acolytes, collecting offering, singing in the children's choir: our congregations have long found ways to include even some of the smallest members of the family of God in worship leadership.

Last Advent, the Colver and Ebensburg Churches sought out new ways to actively include children in worship. From Colver's Hanging of the Greens service to Ebensburg's "Jesse Tree" (which includes biblical symbols from Creation to the birth of Christ), it was the children who led the adults into a deeper experience of that season of hope and expectation. And during worship each Sunday, the children helped to usher a ceramic Mary and Joseph (very carefully!) ever closer to the manger at the front of the sanctuary.

On Christmas Eve, each church celebrated the culmination of that hope and waiting with their own Service of the Nativity. As the Christmas story unfolded through readings and carols, members ages one to ninety-three rose from their seats around the sanctuary and brought forward the figurines to complete the scene, beginning with Mary and Joseph and Jesus, then adding the animals, shepherds and angels. It was a very special moment when one of the most dedicated members of Ebensburg, who was also a preschooler, carefully cradled the tiny Jesus figurine in her hands and placed him on the straw. When a young couple at Colver brought their yearold daughter forward with them as they placed baby Jesus in the manger, the humanity and beauty of the Christmas story touched the congregation in a new way.
