Christian Ed – Sandy Chappell -VBS materials are in and Linda Chicka is working on Clearances **Mission and Stewardship**: Linda Chicka - Minute for Mission will continue each Sunday.

Congregational Life - Connie Cauvel -Graduation Sunday, May 8 – Mother's Day committee member Karen Staymates presented Jacob Slaugenhaupt with an inscribed copy of Streams in the Desert. Committee would like to thank Patty Lengauer for inscribing his book with her beautiful calligraphy. We are preparing a brunch for Music Appreciation Sunday, 10 AM in Fellowship Hall. Committee is beginning to review our Roll and at the end of this process it is our hope that this will be an opportunity to reach out to people and enhance Roll.

Technology - Chad McCutcheon - Met May 2, 2016. Phone/Internet/Wi-Fi Update – recommends Comcast Business as our provider. Comcast Business and their services is the first step to creating a Wi-Fi system at Poke Run. It is a necessary step in the process. Comcast Business has excellent customer service and great speeds. Church Laptop/Projector Update - In April 2016, Session approved a laptop and projector to be used by the Church for Sunday School/Bible School/Church presentations and functions. The Committee is still researching options for a projector, but has narrowed in on a few, which have Wi-Fi connection capabilities. Sound System Updates - Linda Chicka and Bob Wilson are in the process of creating a simple Do It Yourself User Guide for the Sound System. This should make it easier for people to volunteer to operate the Sound System and eventually develop a sound system operator's rotation. CD Recorder-The current CD recorder is old, showing signs of age, and should be replaced. Chad McCutcheon is working to find an MP3/CD Recorder, which can be used with our system. This will enable us to have both digital and CD copies of church services.

The Poke Run Session adopted the following policy on May 10, 2016. If you have any questions regarding how this policy applies to you, please contact the Poke Run Office.

Policy to Safe Guard Children and Youth March 2016 through February 2017 Any policy changes will be provided to Session

I. Philosophy

Poke Run Presbyterian Church is a congregation committed to ensuring the safety and protection of our children and youth from any physical, sexual, or emotional abuse. Therefore, the Session has adopted this policy to provide direction for Poke Run Church employees and volunteers, parents, members and visitors to the church and how to seek to safeguard our children and youth and nurture them in Christian love.

The church is committed to maintaining a wholesome and safe environment for work, worship, study, and fellowship for all inspired by Christian love.

II. Guidelines

- A. Age and Qualifications of Caregivers, Volunteers, Christian Educators: Must be 18 years or older or accompanied by a caregiver age 18 or older.
- B. During all functions that involve children such as Sunday School and Vacation Bible School, it is our policy that two adults with complete Pa Clearances be present and lead the organization of the program. When a group of minors being sponsored by Poke Run Presbyterian Church is on an overnight event, the adult leaders' gender(s) must include at least one of the gender corresponding to the gender(s) of the group. For example, if the youth group is of mixed gender, there would be at least one man and one woman chaperone present.
- C. The qualifications and appropriateness of any person wishing to be involved in any Christian Education program at Poke Run Presbyterian Church will be reviewed and determined by the Pastor and Personnel Committee. Also these persons must read and acknowledge the policy by signing the form, "Acknowledgement and Understanding of Policy."
- D. Poke Run Presbyterian Church will strive to provide a physical environment that minimizes the risk of harm and supports the careful supervision and appropriate interactions with the leaders between children and youth. Physical surroundings and group size should allow adequate space and visibility for monitoring. All considerations need to be taken such as leaving doors open.
- E. No ministry volunteer shall provide transportation for youth alone without written permission from the youth's parent.
- F. Abuse shall be defined:
 - For purposes of this policy, child abuse is any action (or lack of action) that endangers or harms a child's physical, psychological or emotional health and development. Child abuse occurs in different ways and includes but is not limited to the following:
 - Physical Abuse any physical injury to a child or youth that is not accidental, such as beating, shaking, burns, or biting.
 - Emotional Abuse emotional injury when the child or youth is not nurtured or provided with love and security, such as an environment of constant criticism, belittling, persistent teasing.
 - Sexual Abuse any sexual activity between child or youth and an adult including activities such as fondling, exhibitionism, intercourse, incest, and pornography.
 - Neglect depriving a child or youth of his / her essential needs such as food, water, warmth, attention
- G. Non-church groups that are not directly sponsored by Poke Run Presbyterian Church will be expected to follow the policy of safeguarding children and youth.

III, Background Checks and Other Documentation

Poke Run Presbyterian Church requires the following for the staff and volunteers that have direct contact and / or that are working with children and youth. Paid staff will have updated documentation on file in the office. The Church Secretary will keep on file all of the documentation of both staff and volunteers.

The paid Church Staff with direct contact with children will have:

- 1. Pennsylvania Child Abuse History Clearance from the Childline and Abuse Registry. www.epatch.state.pa.us
- 2. Pennsylvania Department of Human Services Child Abuse History Clearance Report www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis/public/home
- 3. Federal Criminal History Report; (fingerprint-based background check) FBI www.pa.congentid.com

Volunteers that have direct contact with children will have:

- 1. Pennsylvania Child Abuse History Clearance from the Childline and Abuse Registry. www.epatch.state.pa.us
- 2. Pennsylvania Department of Human Services Child Abuse History Clearance Report www.compass.state.pa_us/cwis/public/home
- 3. Poke Run Presbyterian Church approved Affidavit/ Volunteer Exemption for Federal Criminal History Record (FBI Fingerprint clearance) Child Protective Services Law PA Act 153 of 2014
- IV. Exceptions to Background Check Requirements:
 - 1. Any volunteer under the age of 18 is exempt from the above mentioned background checks.
- V. Procedures for Reporting and Handling Violations
 - 1. All accusations and suspicions of child abuse are to be reported immediately to the Program Leader or Coordinator, who will report and alert the Church Pastor or Clerk of Session.
 - 2. It is the responsibility of the person that has witnessed or suspects abuse to take action by calling Childline, the PA Child Abuse Registry 24 hours a day by calling 1-800-932-0313.
 - 3. Additionally, the reporting individual must complete the form "Report of Suspected Child Abuse" and submit to the Clerk of Session.

If a volunteer observes behavior or overhear conversation that causes suspicion, it is not their role to further investigate or provide counseling. Because of the sensitive nature of such accusations and suspicions, volunteers should not share this information with others with the exceptions listed above in Section V, Item 1 and 2.





JOIN FOR FELLOWSHIP AND REFRESHMENT BETWEEN EARLY SERVICE AND SUNDAY SCHOOL

Minute For Mission – For over 10 years, members of Poke Run have traveled to the Appalachian areas of WV and VA to assist elderly, disabled and low income individuals and families with housing repairs and improvements. What started out as a mission supported only by Poke Run, has grown to include involvement and support from as many as 8 churches last year. Poke Run has partnered with Project Crossroads in Marion, VA to accomplish this work. This program determines the individuals that need served, sets up projects, purchases materials, establishes work schedules, and locates housing for visiting mission teams like ours. The Poke Run congregation helps support the mission team with funds for food to feed the mission trip attendees and funds to Project Crossroads for the work supplies. Mission trip attendees from other churches also contribute funds from their congregations. The individuals that travel with the team donate their time, skills, and resources to help serve God's people.

This year's Poke Run sponsored Mission Trip of over 20 volunteers was commissioned for their journey to the Marion Virginia area for the week of June 19 through 23, 2016. This year's group represents the congregations of Poke Run, 1st Baptist Church of Apollo, New Beginnings Baptist, 1st Baptist Church of Woodbridge, Park Baptist of McKeesport, Clarksburg Presbyterian Church and Grace Community Presbyterian Church. Five Poke Run members will participate: Josh Porterfield, Linda Chicka, Bob Wilson, Freda Bowman and Edyth Elwood. Please keep all the participants and those they serve in your prayers.





Minute For Mission - The Union Mission is a Christian organization locat-The Union Mission ed in Latrobe, PA that provides a temporary haven to men in need and assists them in building interdependent relationships. It is the only shelter in Westmoreland County serving homeless men. On average they

serve over a hundred men per year. The Mission provides for the overall treatment of the individual through a structured program that includes counseling, case management, life skills training, spiritual development, and education. The environment at the Mission fosters character development, morality, and bonds of friendship and family. They are able to provide a "stepping stone" to return as productive, respectful members of the community. The Union Mission only has a recidivism rate (return to homelessness) of 7.8% compared to the national average of 44%. Through a series of poor decisions and or bad circumstances, any person could find themselves without shelter. The Union Mission offers refuge, hope, and opportunity to those who truly need help to begin putting the broken pieces of their life back in order. 

"Several thousand people are expected to gather in Portland, Oregon, on Saturday, June 18, for the opening worship service of the 222nd General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). But the congregation could potentially be much larger—with groups of Presbyterians across the country using live stream

technology to participate in opening worship ... The Committee on the Office of the General Assembly (COGA) is encouraging congregations and mid councils to gather groups in their locations to worship with the assembly via live stream... "The concept is a unified PC(USA) participating in worship from all corners of the country and the world." The assembly's opening worship service begins at 11 a.m. Pacific Daylight Time and is scheduled to last about ninety minutes. It will include communion, the commissioning of assembly commissioners and advisory delegates, a sermon by outgoing Moderator Heath Rada, and music by a mass choir, a bell choir, and a contemporary band. The liturgy for the service—including the words and music of hymns—is available online for download by groups planning to worship in other locations."


