From Pastor Pete

Light and darkness – images that cascade throughout the Bible - define for us the pathways that we walk in our lives. Hints abound giving us guidance for faithful living. "Thy Word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path," says the Psalmist. The "Word" we believe is both Scripture and Christ. Jesus tells us, "You are the light of the world," addressing us across the centuries. "You are the light of the world, " not someone else. There is more. " ..., let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven."

During a time of reflection on 1 Thessalonians 4:1-13 this thought came to me. A human life is like the lamps used in biblical times.



Lamps were crafted from clay so that they contained a cavity for oil and an opening through which a wick extended from the oil into the surrounding air. When lit these lamps produced sufficient light for one to see at night, in the darkness. In these lamps the quality of the oil and the integrity of the wick determine the brightness of the flame.

A human being is a body-mind -spirit we can use as an analogy for a lamp. The body is the outer container. The oil that feeds the wick in a lamp can be compared to the food we drink and the liquids that we ingest. These sustain the body and the mind, like the oil in a lamp that feeds its flame. The TV programs we watch, the movies we see, the books we read, and the friends with whom we associate also feed us. They nourish or diminish the mind. If the food is good and the liquids pure we will, in normal circumstances, live healthy lives. Our lives are like the flame of the lamp. Our lives are what the world sees. They define us to others.

Now let's think about this from the Christian perspective. I am going to shift the analogy a bit. The Christian life is a life renewed by the Holy Spirit. In this new life the body-mind is the container for the indwelling Spirit who gives us the Christ life. This is a spiritual life given to us by grace through the Spirit. We can see this life as the oil that feeds the wick that is the source of the flame that is our life. When we are filled with the Spirit we shine with a new brightness that can be seen by others. We become lamps that shine in the darkness to show the way of Christ to the world.



"Betty Schmidt had a home full of antiques and a heart full of love for her family and her music. "Her life really revolved around her music, her family and her church," said the Rev. Peter Goetschius of Poke Run Presbyterian Church, where Mrs. Schmidt filled in as an organist during the past 12 years.....Music was very important to Mrs. Schmidt. "Our house was always full of music," Shultz said. "She spent a lot of time practicing piano and organ, and she taught private lessons, as well....Mrs. Schmidt was a church organist for many years at First Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh. Shultz said her father used to tell stories about the children leaving the pews in church to run up front to try to join their mother on the organ bench.Mrs. Schmidt and her husband loved antiques and operated

Schmidt's Springhouse Antiques at Route 66 and Pfeffer Road. Shultz said she will remember her mother as "a woman of grace." 
