#### Poke Run Presbyterian Church— "The Ranger" December 2017



The writer of Ecclesiastes, whoever she or he may have been, tells us that there is a season, a time for every matter under heaven. The writer also tells us that God ... has made everything beautiful in its time, and, has put

eternity into the human heart. These are powerful statements, and so, it might be enlightening to follow them into the future and to see, just what is beautiful and where eternity might lead us. To do that I am going to keep words of Paul in 1 Corinthians 13 on the edges of my mind as I write. The words are, "So now, faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love."

So now, here is my rather wobbly and torturous path from Ecclesiastes to St. Paul. It began with a book. Books should make us think. Good books must be read with paper and pen or pencil – or laptop – not so that notes can be made but so that thoughts can be recorded. Thoughts are fleeting and must be captured if they are to be useful. There are times to read frivolous novels for entertainment and balance, just as there are times to watch TV shows and sports and news and ... see Ecclesiastes chapter 3 for more details. There are also times to read books that impact you "like a hammer blow between the eyes" – from Camus I think, or Kafka, writers I read 50 years ago when still a child who thought he was an adult.

Here is the line in a book that got me to thinking, "... a Benedictine monk – forever unknown – said that there is no such thing as faith or prayer or love, only people who believe, who pray, and who love." The philosopher in me immediately set to work on this. Question, "Do faith or prayer or love have an independent existence?" Yes, I know that is what we call an "existential" question but I believe it is an important one with which we must struggle, and that is what I am asking you to do. Struggle with this for a moment, please. Another way to ask this that might make it clearer is, "If there were no human beings, leaving God out of the picture for a moment, - if there were no human beings, would there be faith or prayer or love?"

You see, faith must be in someone; we cannot have faith in natural process, they just happen. Prayer must be to someone from whom we expect a reply. Love must be a relationship between two or more persons who have learned to trust each other. In other words, faith and prayer and love exist only in relationships. Relationships can be broken. Now for another moment I want to step into the realm of sin and evil, and then we will come back to love and

God's gift of God's self, completing, or perhaps

squaring the circle.

I am going to define, or redefine, as does Tim Keller, sin. I am going to say that sin is what fractures or damages or even weakens relationships of love or faith, or hope. This is only a partial definition but it will do for this short essay. More broadly, sin is what damages, weakens or destroys the good. For me, sin and what repairs the damage of sin is nowhere more visible than at the German concentration camp Dachau. As you go through Dachau it becomes apparent that over time conditions for the imprisoned Jews became more and more horrific. As one person close to us said, "It just gets worse and worse." The feeling is a mixture of what you feel at Gettysburg and the Viet Nam Wall, combined with terror and dread. You can literally feel it. It does get worse and worse until your reach the ovens where thousands of bodies were incinerated. It is sickening. One feels here the evil that destroys love. Then, just beyond the ovens, is a beautiful Carmelite chapel where exactly the opposite happens. You enter the chapel through a rose trellis into a quiet and peaceful space. It is unlike anything else I have experienced. Here in the midst of the remaining terror, is love. It is indescribable. Here is beauty, faith, hope, and love gathered within the prayers of Carmelite nuns. It overcomes the evil and the fear and the hate and the dread.

And so we have, faith, hope, and love, and the greatest of these is love.

This is the love we anticipate in Advent, a love that comes to us through the birth of Christ, a relationship that is God given, for to us, for us.


College student care/study packages will be packed and mailed by Carol Thompson and Nancy Kimble. Names and addresses will be reviewed at the next meeting.




