

# Poke Run Presbyterian Church "The Ranger" JANUARY 2018

D. Martyn Lloyd Jones, perhaps our last great English-speaking preacher in the line of the Puritans began a series of sermons on the Gospel of John on October 7, 1962. As he began he was clear that this was not a verse-by-verse trip through the gospel, but a teaching of the doctrines that he felt were most needed in his time. He makes two startling claims in his first sermon on John. The first one is this, "Do you know what is the matter with us. I will tell you. *We none of us really believe in the Lord Jesus Christ.*" I am not going to deal with this first claim in this essay. It is the second remarkable statement that claims my attention. Here it is. "The Gospels, like everything else in the New Testament, were not written for the world; they were written for believers."

The times ahead are not clear. We may not know exactly what, but we do know that we will see changes due to technological advance. Hyundai and VW are in talks with an AI – artificial intelligence – firm so that they can produce self-driving cars. Their target date to have them on the market is 2021. Perhaps they will and perhaps they will not. The reality is that massive transportation changes driven by very sophisticated computers are on the way. Robots may – or may not – soon be serving us at fast food restaurants. Either way, hidden or visible, robotics is rapidly changing our world from the service industry to manufacturing. We have not touched on technologies you may not have heard of like nano-tech, which could change medicine and everything else forever. All of this will create huge social upheavals that we are not ready for at this time.

Speaking of social changes who would have believed even twenty years ago that laws would change as they have? I can remember sitting in a high school auditorium in Cumberland MD

at a town hall type meeting where we were told that marijuana would never be legalized in any form. Today as you drive into Cumberland on Interstate 68 you are met with the wonderful news that Medical Marijuana is available. It's a very large sign. You can hardly miss it. Dare I mention marriage, gender, or any number of other hot button items.

One more social change that has and will continue to have known and unknown effects on our thinking and ability to think: social media. Social media seems so friendly. We have hundreds and thousands of friends, a constant flow of texts to tell us how nice we are, and numerous other inducements to feel good about ourselves. Until recently, no one was willing to tell us about the dark side of all this. Every time we get a response on our phone or tablet something happens in our brain. It says, "Oh, somebody wants me!" It perceives this as a good thing, and, watch out now, turns on the same chemical receptors that are turned on by alcohol, caffeine, nicotine, cocaine, and a host of other drugs. In other words, social media has been designed to be addictive. So has just about everything else we watch along with games but that lets the topic get out of hand. We have laws controlling or prohibiting other dangerous substances but we let our young children have free access to iPhones and tablets. As the corner man said to the boxer who refused to take his advice, "Good luck!"

So what does D. Martyn Lloyd Jones and his sermons on John have to do with all this. Well, he preaches in the 1960's, also times of rapid change, but it wasn't the changes that he addressed. He addresses humanity at its most basic unchanging level. Every human being is captive to sin. His words were "the biblical view of man is that he is dead in his sins." No one wants to hear that anymore so I softened it a bit. Every

human being is captive to sin and we are all of us, everyone, blind to this. (See here 2 Cor. 4:3-4, Eph 4:17 and what follows) It is only through the salvation offered by and in the gospel that we are brought into the light of God in Christ. In John's words we are brought from darkness to light.

To bring people, all people, to this light is the primary task of the church through the preaching of the Word of God and it is only the church who can do this. Our task lies ahead of us.

It does not matter if we continue to come to church in our cars and trucks and SUVs with their internal combustion engines, or whether we switch to nice clean burning electric cars or are brought by little tin box robot cars or if Uber takes over the transportation tasks of the nation. What matters is that those who do not know hear the gospel. That will never change. Yes, the gospels are written for us, so that we may witness their message to the world.

**Epiphany** is the celebration of God's manifestation or self-revelation to the world in Jesus Christ. In particular, we celebrate the revelation of God's promise and purpose to the nations of the world, as the magi came from the East to worship to the Christ child, and God's covenant of grace is extended to all who believe the good news of Christ Jesus. The symbolism of light is important: not only because of the star that guided the

magi, but as it relates to the bright dawning of God's self-revelation in Christ. **January 6th**

**Baptism of the Lord** At the beginning of his public ministry, Jesus presents himself to John to be baptized in the Jordan. The heavens open, the Holy Spirit descends as a dove and we hear the voice of God: "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased" (see Psalm 2:7). At this festival of the Christian year, we not only remember Jesus' baptism, but we celebrate our own: the baptism we share with Christ.

Accordingly, this Sunday is an appropriate time to celebrate the sacrament of baptism or the reaffirmation of the baptismal covenant. It also foreshadows the season of Lent, as Jesus was immediately

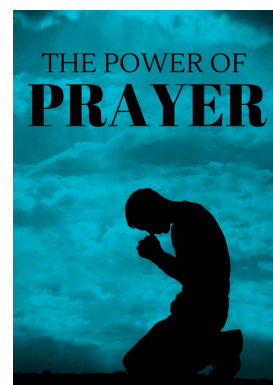
driven into the wilderness for 40 days after his own Baptism. **Sunday, January 7th**
