POKE RUN PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH RANGER MAY 2018

Many people asked about Pastor Pete's sermon of April 15th – What follows was transcribed from the recording of that sermon. (using scripture: 1 John 3:1-7)

In beginning I am going to make a couple comments to try to set the tone, for what I'm going to do. I'm going to say that this sermon or this talk or whatever you would like to call it, begins on what's called a dialectic, that is it begins in one place and ends somewhere very different.

This is an old style of thinking through a problem, ... well maybe he didn't popularize it, but certainly Karl Bart used it a hundred years ago. He created what was called Dialectical theology, and if you ever read him he begins somewhere and leaves you thinking: He can't believe this, he can't believe this, he can't believe this, oh this is it. It's that kind of an argument it goes clear back to Socrates. Socrates was an expert at it

The idea is that we begin with an idea, and examine it and examine it and examine it and find out that it fails us but that it opens up to us a new idea that is better, more powerful and more effective in our lives. Very often when I meet someone new, it's not all that long until they will ask well what is it that you do? And I used to have an answer like well I do communications theory for a very large non-profit of 1.8 million people and by golly you have their attention immediately and that's true, That's what we do. But I felt that was a little bit, I don't know, not as direct as it could be, so now that I'm older I say I'm a minister and almost invariably I get one of three responses.

Ah, good And then nothing. Often people will turn away, there's a message here, it's not the one I'm going into today they're not quite sure what to do with that. The second response I often get is, well you know I'm a very religious person and I've done all these wonderful things and on and on they go and all of sudden you figure out they've never been in a church, they've never been in a synagogue, they've never been in a mosque, They've never been in a temple but by golly they think that because you're a minister they should tell you all these wonderful things about how great they are. I know people are people, but the third thing that happens and more often than you would think, is all of a sudden this rush of words will come out with a big big story, very important to them, will almost gush out of them.

This is the second thing I want to say, I made this story up, there's nobody that ever told me this story. I made it up to make a point for this sermon. And I found I have to say this because when I don't someone will come up and say who told you that story, or how did you know?

Let's say we are sitting on an airplane and I meet somebody new and they're not being silent and they're not telling me what a



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wonderful person they are but they start to tell me something important like, and I think you know, I really don't want to hear about your seven minute affair with the Jamaican flute player on the night of your honeymoon, when your spouse was passed out, and you had too many tequila shots. I really don't want to hear about that, I really want to just lean back and go to sleep really And I used to think these people were bragging but they're not, they're not at all. I know better now. What I know now or at least what I think I know now, no I'm relatively positive about this, all of us carry deep deep deep feelings of shame and guilt. Every single one of us carries these. Some of them because of something as crazy as this little story. Some of them because of something that happened when we were very young and we cannot process it. Some of them because of events that happened to us and we don't really know what to do with them, but all of us carry somewhere some shame and some guilt and often it is over some crazy thing that we did and this really surprises me because for the past 20 to maybe 40 maybe even 60 years we've been trying to tell people there is no right and wrong. If It's right for you. Seemed good at the time didn't it? We've been trying to tell people that right and wrong are relative. We've been trying to tell people anything goes. We've been trying to tell people that what happens in Vegas or Jamaica stays in Vegas right? Yeah, that's what we've been trying to say to people for a long long time and it's not working. Our memories are much much deeper and more powerful than that. It's simply not true that anything goes. Our past, our deep resources of memory impact us continually in more and more powerful ways. This buried memories, this guilt and shame controls us in ways that we often don't understand and forces us to act. Why did i do that, anyway? And what's even more amazing, we probably use the word amazing too much, but it is amazing that people will go on doing the same things again and again. They will do the same things that have harmed them and hurt them and caused them damage. They'll do them over and over and over. Fascinating, in a very odd way. We will keep repeating the same harmful actions again and again. Now this does not mean, and I will be very careful about this, this does not mean that people, or you and I are bad or evil or crazy. It does not mean that at all. I'm going to expand on this in a minute. But what we are, and John is very clear about this is we are God's children. Every single one of us is here, if we accept the biblical story, because

of Adam and Eve. And Adam and Eve were formed by God in God's image. And we are alive because God breathed God's breath into us and that's why every single one of us is animated and has life. And if we are Christians, we are animated by the Holy Spirit. And we are even more fully children of God. every one of us, every single one of us has this spark of life in us and even Calvin admitted this. I'm sure he had his teeth clinched tightly when he said it, but even Calvin admitted that every single one of us is a child of God.

What's happening in all this craziness that goes on in our lives is we are seeking relief. There is something in us that is hurting us and we are trying to put some kind of salve on that. In John's language, we go on sinning because we don't know any other way. We have not met the Christ we have not met the one who can turn us into a direction that is healthy and whole and wholesome. We have not yet met Christ as Lord, and so we go on again and again, banging our shins on the same coffee table and aren't smart enough to turn on the light when we get up to go the bathroom. No, and our task as those who have met the risen Christ, is to be a blessing to people who haven't. Our task when we hear these stories, or to take our own stories even, is not to judge, is not to condemn, but to reach out in compassion because this is what makes us whole. It's love that accepts, that makes us whole and only that. Our task is, first of all to help people heal the shame in their lives and note I only said shame. Because only Christ can heal the guilt.

So I'm going to take a few moments and expand on the idea of shame and guilt. Guilt and shame are not the same. The difference is very subtle but it's also huge. This idea comes from a woman, I think she is in her fifties now, her name is Brene Brown. Anybody listened to her? She has numerous TED talks, she's on You Tube, She's been on Oprah. Her research started on what she called vulnerability. She was originally part of the happiness crowd but over the years she has shifted that to try to talk about guilt and shame. And so some of these words are ,if you go out and look at her videos some of them are only a couple minutes some of her TED talks, 18 or minutes, will resonate.

Guilt and shame again, are not the same. Guilt says I did something bad. Shame says I'm a bad person. Do you see the difference? Because the difference is absolutely huge. The two are not really connected at all. Guilt says I did something bad. Shame says I am a bad person. Shame is highly correlated with guess what, addiction. shame is highly correlated with depression and violence and aggression and bullying and eating disorders And listen carefully to this also guilt is inversely correlated with addiction, depression, violence, aggression, bullying and eating disorders.

In other words, people who feel shame tend to fall into these categories, people who are guilty do not. Why would that be? Well you see if I'm willing to say well I made a mistake I can fix it, if I say I am a mistake, I can't fix that. So the only way that I can try to fix that is too much booze or too much aggression or too much dope or too much anger or too much bullying. See how it works I am trying to cover up something that cannot be covered up ever, but If I can say you know, I really shouldn't have broken Johnny's nose I can fix that. Guilt can be positive and shame never is. And this too, this example I got from Brene Brown. If we were to take shame and remember, Shame is saying I am a bad person and examine it in a petri dish, those little glass dishes that chemists and biologists and a few other scientists use to examine things,. They put a little bit of chemical in there and watch the reaction go or you put a bunch of little critters in there and put sugar in there and see what happens to them. If you were to put shame in a petri dish and watch it, what makes it grow is three things, secrecy and silence and judgement. Where there is secrecy, silence and judgement there is shame. When this happens, when we are afraid to speak our stories, When we are judged or feel judged, shame grows exponentially. And what shuts it down is bringing it out into the open, telling the story. And that's what would be happening with this person on the airplane.

If they can tell their story and be accepted and be loved and say yes, that was a very bad thing you did, but you are a good person Something very different happens because now we can fix things, now we can change our life and we won't go on repeating the same horrible effects again and again and again. And so, and this is very abbreviated, if there is shame in your life or you are dealing with someone who has shame in their life, talk to yourself or talk to them as someone you deeply love, this allows the expression and the cleansing that needs to happen.

I've talked to so many people that say I can believe that God loves you but I can't love myself. You have to get this out You have



to talk to yourself, you have to love yourself and You have to care for yourself and accept yourself.
Reach out to somebody you trust and tell your story because one of things we know is that Shame cannot survive being out in the light, it simply cannot. And we need to fix this.

So here is the other side of the dialectic what I'm really driving at, is that I do want to hear your story. And I don't mean I want you all to come to me and tell me all the horrible things that have ever happened in your life. I do care, and I want you to care about other people and care for other people that's what we are called to be as Christians. From the first call of

Abraham on, we are called to be a blessing to the world and we can be a blessing to the world by listening, by getting this stuff out. See we want to hear these wounded hearts so they can be healed. That's what we want and then we want to tell an even greater story. We want together to listen for the whisper of the Spirit, we want to Listen for God's voice, we want to hear that the guilt we carry has already been taken care of, this is something only God can do.

We want to go beyond our human counseling shall we say And Reach out into the spiritual life and learn that in Christ all sins are forgiven, they were taken care of at the cross. You can do something like, say Well let me tell you four ways to be happy, or my suggestion is that you not drink so much Tequila and then you won't do something foolish and you won't have a ferocious hangover the next day. But this does not get to the root of the problem. What does is when God comes in and changes a human heart so that we are new people. And about this John is very clear, Christ came to take away sins. He came to cleanse us from all that guilt. In fact the guilt of the whole world. A kind of a total restructuring of us as human beings to make us sinless to make us pure to make us holy. To say yes we are God's children now, we are God's children now, always. God knows your story and God loves you. God knows your guilt and God took it on God's self.

So to sum up, we all carry guilt and shame, which means we should be kind to each other. We define guilt and shame. Guilt is I did something bad, shame is I am bad. And we want to eliminate shame. It's behind so many of society's problems now. But we know that shame cannot survive in the light, when it is brought out into the open, When it is spoken, when it is accepted and people are loved. And so we want to Listen to each other's stories and bring healing. And then tell people this greater story of God's love in Christ.

Let's pray

Holy God we see what kind of love you have given us, that we should be your children and so we are.



B&F requested that T Kimble bring summary to Session Meeting to discuss what level of commitment Poke Run is directing toward payment of scholarships. B&F discussed various options on how to insure money was to allocated to Pine Springs camperships (depending on level of commitment from Session). Various options included, but not isolated to setting up a separate fund or having a line item in Benevolence budget. **Christian Ed & Youth:** Sandy Chappell - Report from Bob Wilson: The Christian Ed committee needs to develop a policy for camper ships. To define the programs the child needs to participate in. Also at what level of support the fund supply, and what will happen when there is not enough money to cover the costs. **Mission and Stewardship:** Bob Wilson - At the Mission and Stewardship meeting on March 7, 2018 they passed

Mission and Stewardship: Bob Wilson - At the Mission and Stewardship meeting on March 7, 2018 they passed a **MSC**: One time contribution to move \$5000 from the 10% of the annual interest earned by the unrestricted fund aka the 10% fund) set aside for disbursement by the Mission and Stewardship committee to setup a Pine Spring Campership Fund with the following parameters. To be eligible the child needs to participate in a program at Poke Run. The fund needs to be promoted to the congregation because donations are how the fund will continue to exist. The fund can go to \$0. Pete recommends we offer Scholarships with the pre requisite of 1. \$15 application fee. 2. Money will be split evenly among applicants. 3. Offer full scholarships to anyone who has special financial need even though they do not attend Poke Run. Bret suggested we try for reciprocity with other churches. How do we attract these kids to Poke Run? Kids out side of church we will find a way to work it out!






Your Prayer Personality with Rev. Dr. Colleen Molinaro
