"THE RANGER" Poke Run Presbyterian Church 2018

Of course over the summer I read books. I would like to share all of what I read with you. However, much is already forgotten, or, will surface at a later date when needed. Much more is not relevant to you or perhaps anyone. Reading however, or at least non-fiction reading, to quote D. Martyn Lloyd Jones, "should make one think." If a book does this it has done its job, even if it is not particularly well written or organized. If you the reader can pick up the thread of the author's argument, and are compelled to think, or even to change your mind, or to be challenged to defend your ideas, opinions, and beliefs, it is a good book.

With that in mind I am going to share two quotes with you that made me think. Both of them come from the book, <u>Theologies of the Gospel in Context: The Crux of Homiletical Theology</u>, edited by David Schnasa Jacobson. My suspicion is that few people would pick up this book, much less read it. In fact, I would bet on it. To be honest, I skimmed a good bit of a couple of the essays. To my point, at places it made me think.

So let's just jump to the first quote:

At the heart of the Universe lies a mysterious, hidden Being whose very self is moved by love for all that he has created. In the ministry, death and resurrection of Jesus of Nazareth, the being has been revealed as one who is perpetually turning toward us as if to welcome us as if to welcome us home, ...

I love this quote. It is the way I want things to be. I even bought the book it came from, which I will probably never read. Problem is, it is wrong on so many levels. First of all the comma placement is wrong, it is British, not American. But that is a minor quibble – and – my arrogance/sarcasm showing through. I will not go through and deconstruct all that ultimately baffles me. I will only note that wherever the "heart of the Universe" may be," God does not rest there. The Universe is a creation of God's, read Genesis 1:1, and what follows. God is outside the Universe, if we can even say that. God is creator and I disagree completely with those theologians who claim that God somehow made space within himself for our species to dwell. I could go on, but I won't. I only wish to point out that poetic discourse can lead us far astray; no matter how much we like it. People who know me will also know that I will claim that we must read the Bible as poetry, constrained by reality.

This reality is the revelation of God in Jesus Christ in Scripture. The reality is not that God welcomes us home, but that in Jesus Christ God has paid the price for our sins in order to bring us back to Him, and that is a minimalist statement itself. It is not as if we have joyfully gone on a journey and now are asking for return fare home. We have rebelled against our creator and our creator out of love has determined the way "home," a very costly way at that. There is much more to deconstruct here but to go further is not my intent.

I want to share another quote now:

We proclaim God as the one who listens to desolate questions, embraces lament, comforts the broken-hearted.

With a little thought, this made perfect sense. This is the God we all meet. This is the God who comes to us. This is the God who watched his only son die. God suffers! This is a God I can love. This is the God whom we discover in the cracks and crevices of our lives and in the cracks and crevices of Scripture, read well. If God lies hidden somewhere, it is not in the "heart of the Universe" it is behind and under the stories and words of Scripture. In Scripture, God is crucified for us. In our deep sorrow and pain we want, even more than comfort, someone who understands. God understands.

The first quote is nice and very unrealistic. The second quote forces us into the depths of our lives where we meet the God who fully loves us.

And how does this play out? It plays out in Jesus' words, "And this is love, that you love one another just as I have loved you." (John 13:34) Or, "Love one another deeply form the heart." It plays out in the love we show, to the deserving and undeserving in our lives.




